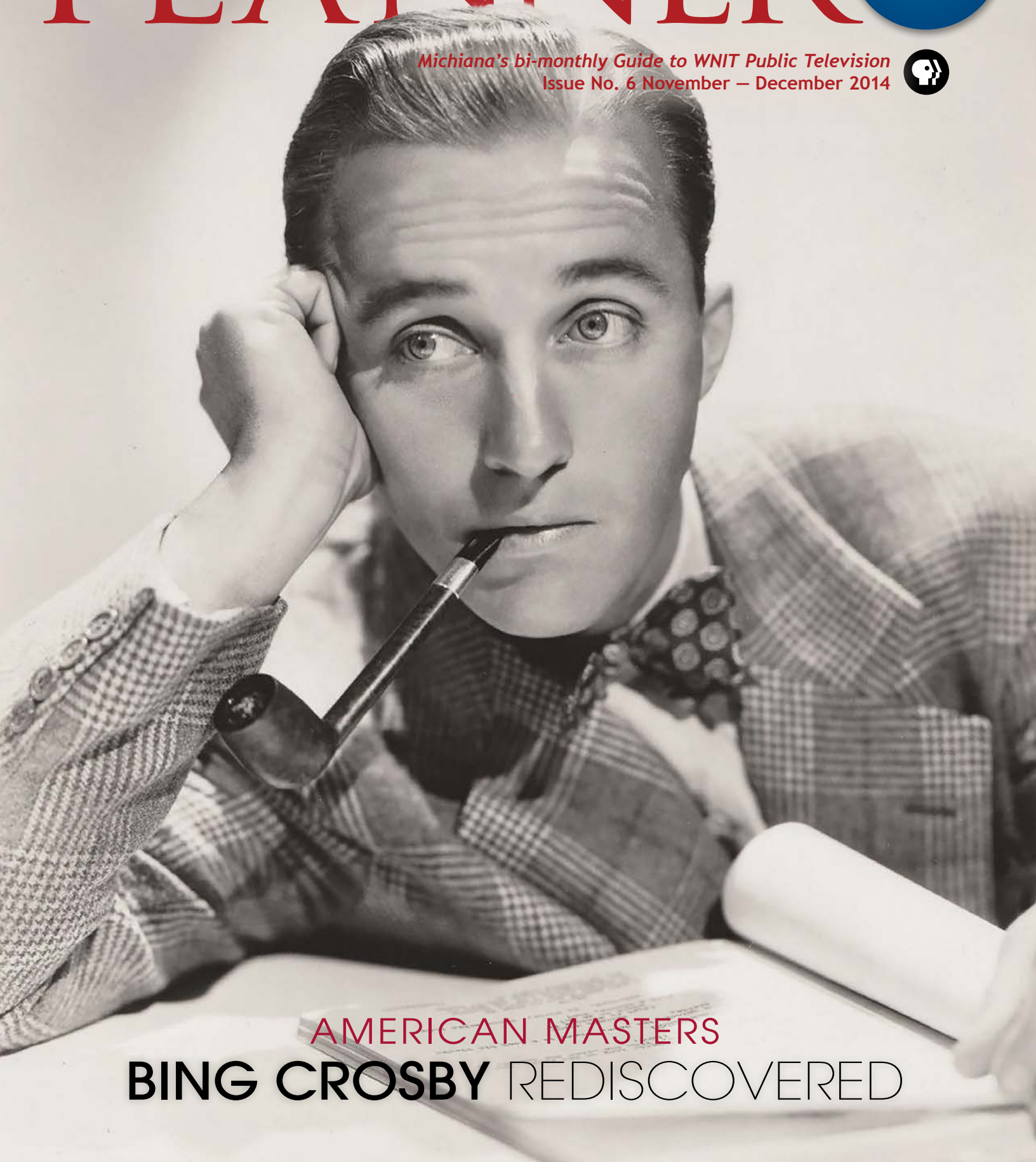

Bing Crosby (May 3, 1903-October 14, 1977) was, without a doubt, the most popular and influential multi-media star of the first half of the 20th century. For more than three decades, through radio, film, television and records, he reigned supreme.

The new documentary *American Masters: Bing Crosby Rediscovered* explores the life and legend of this iconic performer, revealing a man far more complex than his public persona. Crosby's estate granted *American Masters* unprecedented access to the entertainer's personal and professional archives, including never-before-seen home movies, Dictabelt recordings, photos and more. Narrated by Stanley Tucci, the film features new interviews with all surviving members of Crosby's

immediate family — wife Kathryn, daughter Mary and sons Harry and Nathaniel. The film reveals Crosby's struggles with his first wife, Dixie Lee, and their sons Gary, Dennis, Phillip and Lindsay.
