Welcome to the new year and the long-anticipated 5th season of *Downton Abbey*. I've attended our WNIT member events to preview the first hour, now I can't wait to see how it ends!

WNIT has made some changes to our 7pm Monday-Friday schedule. *Experience Michiana* will go from a daily program to a once-a-week show on Fridays. Monday – Thursday, WNIT will broadcast each of our local programs in the 7pm time period – *Dinner & A Book* (Mondays), *Economic Outlook* (Tuesdays), *Outdoor Elements* (Wednesdays), and *Politically Speaking* (Thursdays). These times are in addition to the “regular” airings of these programs.

We have been receiving positive feedback on our new daytime schedule of programs on WNIT's companion channel InFocus, over-the-air channel 34.2. We've kept our early childhood educational programs on our main channel and feature programming for adults on InFocus. I keep a television on in my office and have especially been enjoying the “how-to” programs.

Thank you to everyone who has supported WNIT this past year. We depend on contributions from supporters like you to make our operations possible. It costs nearly \$10,000 per day to operate WNIT, most of that is programming and technology costs. As you plan your giving for 2015, we hope you will consider switching your annual gift to our monthly sustainer program.
