A MESSAGE FROM GREG GICZI President and GM, WNIT Public Television



Dear WNIT Supporters:

I wish our *WNIT Planner* magazine could be monthly, rather than bimonthly. I always have so many interesting items to share with you and I hate to wait so long between editions to pass them along. I am particularly proud of the special local programs coming up in May and June.

The next of our “Legends of Michiana” series of documentaries will have its broadcast premiere on Monday, May 25th at 8pm. We will honor Elkhart’s own Arthur J. Decio – father, grandfather, entrepreneur, businessman, philanthropist, mentor, and Michiana’s mayor of *Sesame Street*. Those of us who have previewed this program have all been inspired by it. I think you will be too.

The City of South Bend has a big birthday this year. It celebrates its 150th year as a city, “SB150”. WNIT will contribute to marking this event with three programs. The first two are coming up in May and June.

On Friday night, May 22nd, we will have a special *Experience Michiana* with Gordy Young. This will be a live broadcast at 9pm covering the festivities and inauguration of the “South Bend River Lights,” a stretch of the St. Joseph River and cascades which will now have permanent, dramatic lighting effects.

On Monday, June 8th at 8pm we will premiere *Our Town: South Bend*, and experience the work of citizen videographers as they tell the story of their city through their own lens. The *Our Town* series of programs are always special because of the unique storytelling. A third documentary related to SB150 will premiere in September. If you had to pick a person or group who were the most instrumental in building and sustaining South Bend’s economy, who would it be? Look for our choice in September.

WNIT, Michiana PBS, relies on three main sources of funding – individuals (viewers like you), corporations, and grants from federal and state government. At this moment, our federal support is in jeopardy. The House of Representatives has passed its budget, stripping all funding for public media. If this is an issue for which you would like to express an opinion, we encourage you to contact your congressperson.

Residents of St. Joseph County, IN, have a special opportunity to double their gifts to WNIT. The Community Foundation of St. Joseph County is sponsoring “Give Local Day” on May 5th. For every dollar you donate to WNIT on May 5th only, the CFSJC will match it, dollar for dollar. This is a great opportunity for all participating non-profits in St. Joseph County. Give WNIT an extra boost on Give Local Day!

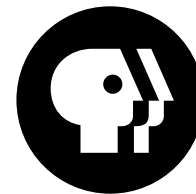

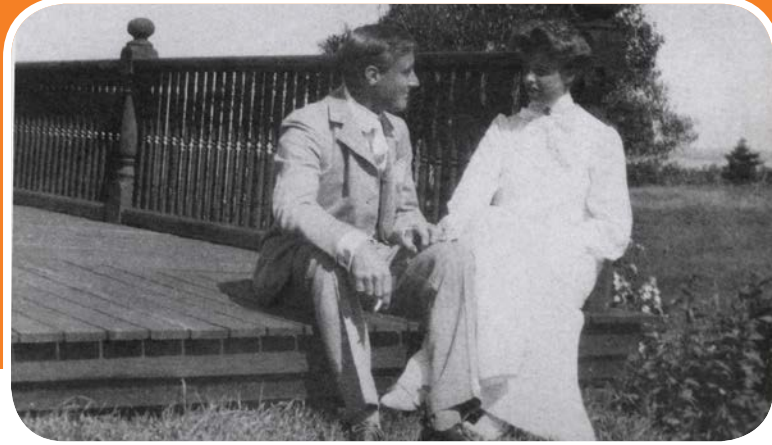

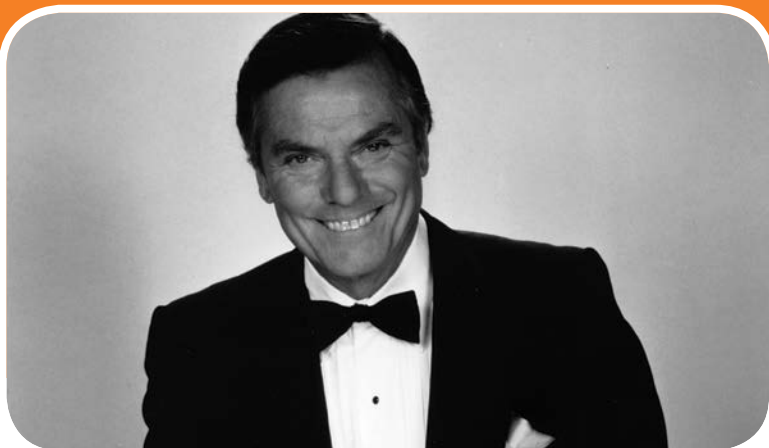

THE ROOSEVELTS: AN INTIMATE HISTORY

TUESDAYS, 8PM 

"THE RISING ROAD" – JUNE 9

Franklin becomes the 32nd President of the United States, introduces the New Deal to help resolve the Great Depression and undertakes the issue of Adolf Hitler's rise in Germany. Eleanor provides Franklin with a liberal perspective and becomes, herself, a political force.

"THE COMMON CAUSE" – JUNE 16

Franklin, after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, promotes America's entry into World War II and eventual Allied victory. During wartime, Eleanor helps to maintain the earlier New Deal initiatives and comforts wounded troops in the Pacific.

"A STRONG AND ACTIVE FAITH" – JUNE 23

Franklin wins a fourth term as President, plans for peacetime but dies while in office on April 12, 1945. Eleanor, after Franklin's death, promotes civil rights, civil liberties and the United Nations. She died in 1962 and was mourned as First Lady of the World.

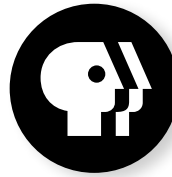

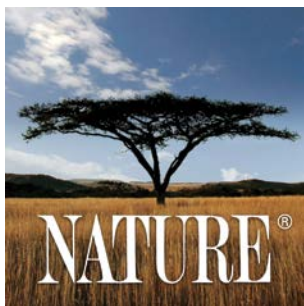

WNIT's professional staff edits these video recordings, and combines them with interviews taken with the volunteer videographers, to professionally tell stories. The results, a one-hour documentary that reflects the emotional ties of the people who live, love and are passionate about their town. In the end, if we've done our job correctly, their town South Bend becomes *Our Town: South Bend*.

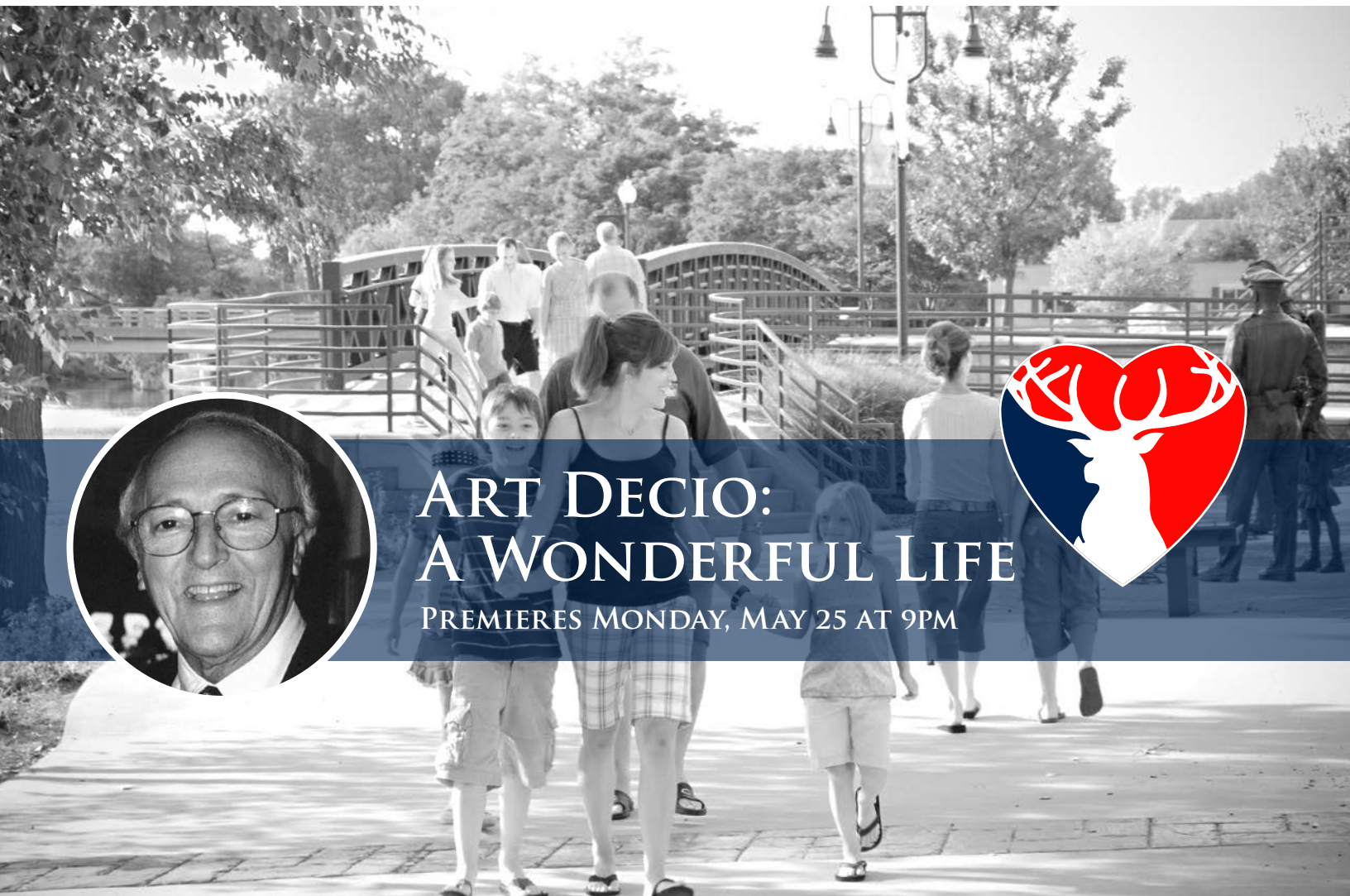
