




## MARY'S MESSAGE

WNIT is PBS for Michiana, and this fall PBS again brings us an astounding array of new programs. First, as seen on the cover and on the page opposite, we renew our commitment to the best in children's programs with the premiere of **The Cat in The Hat Knows a Lot About That!** Voiced by award-winning actor Martin Short, Dr. Seuss's The Cat in the Hat guides friends Sally and Nick – with a little help from the Fish, Thing 1 and Thing 2 – on fun-filled adventures where they make natural-science discoveries, from how bees make honey to why owls sleep during the day. Filled with both adventure and silliness, **The Cat in The Hat Knows a Lot About That!** will appeal to preschoolers' natural curiosity and engage them in the process of scientific exploration and discovery.

Ken Burns extends his historic series of Americana when the **Baseball** series returns with "The Tenth Inning" on September 28 and 29. The new episodes detail the national pastime during the 1990s and 2000s, including the Boston Red Sox as they break "the curse of the Bambino" and win the 2004 World Series. On October 6, WNIT broadcasts a stunning new version of Shakespeare's **Macbeth**, starring Patrick Stewart in the title role and Kate Fleetwood as Lady Macbeth.

In mid-October, WNIT will broadcast a far-reaching documentary called **God in America**. For three consecutive evenings, we will present two episodes of the six-part series. Together, **God in America** addresses two fundamental questions: How has religious belief shaped American history? And, how did America become the world's most religiously diverse nation?

The series explores the origins of America's unique religious landscape and considers the beginnings of America's experiment in religious liberty, including the Bill of Rights. The program continues with religious belief during the Civil War period, followed by the intellectual and cultural conflicts between traditional religious beliefs and the forces of modernity, which reached a crescendo in the 1925 trial of John Scopes, a Dayton, Tennessee teacher arrested for teaching evolution. **God in America** then examines the many contradictions of religion in modern America and concludes with the political aspirations of the religious right, the dynamics of the contemporary religious marketplace, and the re-emergence of a religious voice in the Democratic Party. At the same time America is fast becoming the most religiously diverse nation as Hispanic Catholics, Pentecostals, Muslims, Buddhists and those who consider themselves "spiritual but not religious" enter the ever-expanding religious marketplace.

Whatever the dictates of your conscience in matters of faith, you will find **God in America** to be riveting. It is another in a long list of programs found on PBS and nowhere else. WNIT – bringing the Bigger Picture – and the best programs – to Michiana.

### GREAT PERFORMANCES

**“RENÉE FLEMING & DMITRI HVOROSTOVSKY: A MUSICAL ODYSSEY IN ST. PETERSBURG”**  
WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 8PM

Reigning American soprano Renée Fleming travels to Russia for a special visit to St. Petersburg with her friend and frequent co-star, Russian baritone Dmitri Hvorostovsky. There, in the “Venice of the North,” they explore and perform in some of the most spectacular locations of a city that was born in the remarkable mind and imagination of the young Czar Peter the Great – a city that he named not for himself, but for Saint Peter.

### NATURE

**“DRAKENSBERG: BARRIER OF SPEARS”**  
SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 8PM

The Drakensberg Mountains are southern Africa's Alps, rising more than 11,000 feet into the sky. But beneath their shimmering beauty lies an incredibly hostile environment for the surprising number of creatures that manage to live there. Each spring,

drenching rains destroy the grasslands at the base of the mountains, and those who would survive must climb straight up sheer cliffs of volcanic rock, through gauntlets of storms and snow, to reach the carpets of grass on the plateau.

**“CUBA: THE ACCIDENTAL EDEN”**





## LATIN MUSIC USA

### “BRIDGES”/“THE SALSA REVOLUTION”

The first hour traces the rise of Latin jazz and the explosion of the mambo and the cha-cha as they swept the U.S. from East to West and looks at how Latin music infiltrated rhythm and blues and rock ‘n’ roll through the 1960s. The second hour explores how Puerto Ricans and other Latinos in New York reinvented the son cubano and the plena from Puerto Rico by adding elements from soul and jazz to create salsa – which became a defining rhythm for Latinos the world over.

## “THE CHICANO WAVE”/“DIVAS AND SUPERSTARS”

**WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 9PM**

Mexican Americans in California, Texas and throughout the Southwest created their own distinct musical voices during the second half of the 20th century. This episode shows how their music played an important role in the struggle for Chicano civil rights and ultimately propelled them from the barrio to the national stage. The final hour focuses on the Latin pop explosion of the turn of the 21st century and the success of artists like Ricky Martin, Gloria Estefan and Shakira in the English-language market. As studios concentrate on star-driven pop, Latino youth have gravitated toward urban fusions like Spanish rap and reggaeton, as well as rock en Español.


### “THE QUEEN OF SHEBA”



**THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 10PM**

In the second segment, Wood explores the greatest British myth: the tale of King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table. Traveling around the Celtic world from Cornwall to Wales, Brittany, Ireland and Scotland, Wood uncovers the extraordinary story of how a shadowy Welsh freedom fighter – a Dark Age Che Guevara – became a medieval superman and, finally, the model of a Christian hero.

### PBS PREVIEWS: CIRCUS (HD ONLY)

**SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 12, 10:30PM**

Ever dream of running away with the circus? Go beyond the big top with the traveling Big Apple Circus, where the stories are true and the magic is real. ### LAFAYETTE: THE LOST HERO

### SECRETS OF SHANGRI-LA

In the legendary kingdom of Mustang, a remote corner of the Himalaya previously off-limits to outsiders, a team of explorers and scientists climbs for the first time into human-carved caves thousands of years old. They find priceless 14th-century wall paintings, ancient human remains and a centuries-old hidden library of sacred texts that may reveal some secrets about Shangri-la.

### SECRETS OF THE DEAD

“AZTEC MASSACRE”

**WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 8PM**

Throughout recent times, historians have believed that when the Spanish conquistadors arrived in Aztec territory in the 15th century, they were welcomed as returning

light-skinned gods by the Aztecs, who put up little resistance to their conquest. But now, a new find outside of Mexico City is turning history on its head. The discovery: more than 400 bodies, many of which show signs of having been mutilated and even eaten.

### “IRISH ESCAPE”

It has been called the most outrageous escape story in the history of the high seas. In 1876, after eight years of incarceration at Fremantle Prison in Western Australia, six Irish political prisoners escaped to America on board the American whaler Catalpa. Under the pretext of a whaling voyage, the Catalpa and its unassuming captain, George Smith Anthony, had sailed from New Bedford to liberate the prisoners.

## AMERICAN MASTERS

### “CACHAO: UNO MAS”

**MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 9PM**

Narrated and produced by actor Andy Garcia, American Masters **Cachao: Uno Mas** is an in depth celebration of the legendary Father of the Mambo, Israel “Cachao” Lopez, who died March 2008 in Coral Gables, Florida. Cachao’s remarkable life from his childhood in Cuba, to his early career in America, to his resurgence in the 1990s, is told through performances and interviews with the maestro himself, Gloria and Emilio Estefan, Arturo Sandoval and many others.

### “OROZCO: MAN OF FIRE” (HD ONLY)

**MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 10:30PM**

Often thought of as the other Mexican muralist, beside his more flamboyant compatriot Diego Rivera, Orozco was a leader of the Mexican Renaissance. His bold, dynamic frescoes had a profound impact on American painters and inspired Franklin D. Roosevelt to put artists to work during the Great Depression. His most famous U.S.

murals – The Table of Universal Brotherhood, The Epic of American Civilization and Prometheus – still convey their power in New York, New Hampshire and California.

### “NEW YORK PHILHARMONIC: OPENING NIGHT CONCERT 2010”

**WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22, 9PM**

The New York Philharmonic’s opening night gala features music director Alan Gilbert conducting the U.S. premiere of Jazz Symphony, Wynton Marsalis’ new work for the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra and the Philharmonic.

#### “WALLANDER, SERIES II”

#### “FACELESS KILLERS” – OCTOBER 3

Wallander (Kenneth Branagh) investigates the brutal slaying of an elderly couple at an isolated farmhouse. The fallout from the case leads the detective to doubt everything, including his abilities as a police officer. Alan Cumming hosts.

#### “SHERLOCK”

#### “A STUDY IN PINK” – OCTOBER 24

When an unidentified woman, dressed all in pink, turns up murdered in an abandoned building, Sherlock (Benedict Cumberbatch)

must use the science of deduction to catch the killer. Martin Freeman also stars as John Watson. Alan Cumming hosts.

### AUSTIN CITY LIMITS (HD ONLY)

#### “ALEJANDRO ESCOVEDO/TROMBONE SHORTY” – OCTOBER 23

Rock and funk collide with Alejandro Escovedo and Trombone Shorty. Escovedo blasts out cuts from his *LP Street Songs of Love*. Trombone Shorty follows with a heavy dose of New Orleans funk ‘n’ roll.

### NATURE

SUNDAYS, 8PM

#### “BLACK MAMBA” – OCTOBER 3

The black mamba is one of Africa’s most dangerous and feared snakes, known for being aggressive when disturbed. Rearing up with its head four feet above the ground, it strikes with deadly precision, delivering venom that is packed with three different kinds of toxins 10 times more deadly than needed to kill an adult human. Without treatment, the mortality rate is 100 percent. In Africa, most people kill a black mamba on sight and feel lucky to have done so.

### “THE WOLF THAT CHANGED AMERICA” – OCTOBER 10

In the fall of 1893, an adventurous young man rode out from the salons of New York to the wilds of New Mexico. He went to kill a wolf. Not just any wolf, but an outlaw, the leader of a marauding, cattle killing pack. But by the time Ernest Thompson Seton finally met the renegade Lobo, the wolf had become a hero in his eyes. He would write a tale of that encounter that led both to the establishment of the national park system and the Boy Scout movement in America.

### AMERICAN HORIZONS: THE PHOTOGRAPHS OF ART SINSABAUGH (HD ONLY)

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 3, 10:30PM

Art Sinsabaugh (1924-1983) made his artistic breakthrough in the early 1960s with panoramic landscapes of the Midwest that were unprecedented in both form and subject matter. He used a giant 12x20-inch “banquet” camera that allowed him to marry a sublime and expansive 19th-century vision with mid-20th-century formalism. His remarkable photographs capture a richly nuanced sense of place and the ever-changing face of the American environment.

## AMERICAN MASTERS

### “A LETTER TO ELIA”

MONDAY, OCTOBER 4, 9PM

Elia Kazan’s name was brought front and center to the world again during the buzz surrounding the March 1999 Academy Awards. He was to receive an Oscar for Lifetime Achievement, an honor that divided Hollywood. Then 89 years old, Kazan was primarily remembered for his impressive directorial body of work in the 1950s – *On the Waterfront*, *East of Eden*, *A Streetcar Named Desire*, *Gentleman’s Agreement*, *A Face in the Crowd* – but remained controversial.

### “ASTROSPIES” – OCTOBER 5

While NASA astronauts were captivating the world with the Apollo lunar landings, the U.S. was engaged in a top-secret military manned space program. Now, investigative author Jim Bamford probes the untold story of the elite corps of clandestine astronauts who were never told of the true purpose of their training program. Bamford travels to Russia to reveal the secrets of the Soviet response – the prototypes of the “Almaz” military space stations that, if deployed,

might have led to a Cold War showdown in outer space.

### “BUILDING THE GREAT CATHEDRALS” – OCTOBER 19

Carved from a hundred million pounds of stone, soaring effortlessly atop a spider web of masonry, Gothic cathedrals are marvels of human achievement and artistry. But how did medieval builders reach such spectacular heights? Consuming the labor of entire towns, sometimes taking a hundred years to build, these architectural marvels were crafted from just hand tools and stone. Many now teeter on the brink of catastrophic collapse.



#### **"HERCULANEUM UNCOVERED"**

Just a few miles from fabled Pompeii is Herculaneum, another city buried and frozen in time by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in A.D. 79. 



WNIT shines the spotlight on Charter Board Director Jane Warner, who worked tirelessly to help establish WNIT Public Television. In 1968, a group of local citizens met to form a new kind of station, a public television station for Michiana.
