

The WNIT Center for Public Media is open for business and we are off and running! We are vitally concerned with serving the Michiana community and are eager and able to make it happen. One of the central features of our new facility is the Community Room and it is already being used extensively by several Michiana groups. We have hosted meetings for Arts Everywhere, Restore Michiana and the weekly Lunch & Learn seminars sponsored by Sell South Bend. This nine-week series presents an interesting and informative series of speakers on such topics as the "Early History of South Bend," "South Bend's Diversity," and the region's "Theater and Arts." Each session has attracted about 50 persons to our building for an hour-long lecture and discussion followed by the opportunity to tour the Center.

We also reach out to the community by sponsoring exhibits at three prominent Chamber of Commerce expos. In September, WNIT had a booth at the St. Joseph County Business Expo in the Century Center, in October at the Cornerstone Fall Trade Fair in Benton Harbor and also in October at the Elkhart Biz-Ness Expo at the RV/MH Hall of Fame. These exhibits provide WNIT with an outstanding opportunity to network with regional businesses, to interact with members and viewers, and to share our story with the broader community.

Children and education are always near and dear to our heart. In this vein, WNIT is actively re-creating an updated version of the *Ready to Learn* program as well as a related program known as *Raising Readers*. By the early part of next year, we hope to be presenting *Raising Readers* workshops and classes in several parts of our broadcast area, where we will train the trainers to use everyday materials and common experiences to help teach young children to read. The aim of the program is assisting families to achieve success for their children in school. It is crucial that a child enter kindergarten with basic educational and social skills – the ability to count numbers and read sentences as well as the ability to listen, to share and to be productive.

We are also in the process of developing a very special WNIT Kids Club. As noted in the membership pages of this issue, parents and grandparents can enroll their children and grandchildren in either the *Little Kids Club* (ages 1 to 6) or the *Big Kids Club* (ages 7 to 12). WNIT will host quarterly *Kids Club* birthday events at the WNIT studio and all Kids Club members will receive age-appropriate gift packs, a birthday postcard and a special on-air birthday greeting.

We are beginning to feel at home in our new facility. If you haven't seen it, please give us a call and we will arrange a time to give you a tour. WNIT is PBS for Michiana, and we want everyone in Michiana to appreciate and enjoy the Center for Public Media.

WHAT'S WHAT???

34.1-WNIT HD is a 24-hour high definition channel that showcases the best of PBS with stunning picture and sound clarity. Made possible through the use of digital technology, it is available free over the air with either a digital television set or through a converter box on 34.1. Area cable and satellite providers also carry 34.1 on their HD tiers (for an additional fee). Please contact your service provider for channel placement on the system you use.

34.2-WNIT Digital (which is also referred to as SD or standard definition) is the channel you have been enjoying for years. All your favorites such as Lawrence Welk, British Comedies and How-To programs are right here. 34.2 is also the home for WNIT's line-up of locally produced programs highlighting Michiana and issues that impact our communities. "Outdoor Elements," "Economic Outlook," "Ask an Expert" and "Dinner and a Book" all have their home right here. 34.2 is carried on the basic tier of all local cable and satellite providers.

ON THE COVER

The city of Goshen is featured in WNIT's ongoing "Our Town" series, which already includes *OUR TOWN: SOUTH BEND* (2004) and *OUR TOWN: ELKHART* (2005). WNIT will broadcast *OUR TOWN: GOSHEN* as part of its Membership Campaign (November 26 to December 5) with the volunteer videographers in the studio to answer phones. A Premiere Event will be held about one week prior to broadcast with videographers and their families to watch a preview of the documentary along with the mayor of Goshen, city VIPs, and WNIT staff and management.

With a little training from WNIT's professional, award-winning production team, ordinary citizens became volunteer videographers. Armed with their own home camcorders, they created a video scrapbook of the stories that make Goshen special. WNIT's professional staff utilized these video recordings, along with interviews held by the producers

with the volunteer videographers, to edit professionally the stories and produce an hour documentary that reflects the emotional ties of the people who live, love and are passionate about *OUR TOWN: GOSHEN*.

According to WNIT's Executive Producer Angel Hernandez, "The 'Our Town' series is all about these towns and the people within them who help tell the stories of what makes their special corner of the world unique. Goshen is rich in cultural and historical content – everything from historical sites to traditional high school hang-outs, churches, the college and so many other special places that are known only to those who live in the area and know the true spirit of what Goshen is all about."

Watch *OUR TOWN: GOSHEN* on both WNIT's high definition and standard definition channels on Sunday, December 5 at 6pm and repeated at 7:30pm.



Despite decades of struggle to keep their land, in 1838 thousands of Cherokee were forced from their homes in the southeastern United States and driven to Oklahoma. More than 4,000 died of disease and starvation along the way. Though in the end the Cherokees' embrace of "civilization" and their landmark legal victory proved no match for white land hunger and military power, the Cherokee people were able, with characteristic ingenuity, to build a new life in Oklahoma, far from the land that had sustained them for generations.



RIVERDANCE: LIVE FROM BEIJING

Toradze Documentary an International Hit!

WNIT's documentary *Kicking the Notes the Toradze Way* has just been selected as one of the top 24 finalists at



the prestigious International Television Festival Golden Prague awards in Prague, Czech Republic. The ITF Golden Prague is a unique and prestigious showcase of TV production, presenting the world's best music and dance programs of all musical genres, including classical, rock, pop and world music. The Festival's popularity is ever increasing and last year welcomed 600 accredited guests from 24 countries around the world. *Kicking the Notes the Toradze Way* was first aired by WNIT on December 7, 2009.

Linda Schaller is the project's producer and director and Angel Hernandez, WNIT's vice president of production, is the executive producer. The program was made possible by the Martin Foundation, Brian and Jeannelle Brady, Indiana University Foundation, IU South Bend, Patricia and Arthur J.
