



We hope you enjoyed the holidays and that the new year will be peaceful and prosperous. For WNIT Public Television, the new year brings a significant development. On January 10, WNIT is pleased to introduce a new channel to its viewers, **WNIT InFocus**. WNIT InFocus presents many of the programs you are used to seeing on WNIT's high definition channel, plus an exciting array of in-depth programs revolving around Indiana business and government. Included in this package are *Inside Indiana Business*, *Indiana Lawmakers*, *Indiana Expeditions*, *Across Indiana* and more. WNIT InFocus will be broadcast as channel 34.2 and will provide the opportunity for WNIT to bring viewers even more programs of local and regional interest in the future.

Meanwhile, most of the programs which were previously broadcast over 34.2 will now be seen as WNIT 34.1. This is where you will find such favorites as *Masterpiece Classic*, *Keeping Up Appearances*, *Nature*, *Front Row Center* and all of our local productions – *Dinner and a Book*, *Outdoor Elements*, *Politically Speaking*, *Economic Outlook* and *Ask An Expert*. In short, as of January 10, most of the programs previously seen on 34.1 will be broadcast on 34.2 and vice versa. We have worked closely with the major cable and satellite providers in our area to ensure their cooperation in making these changes.

WNIT has long anticipated making this addition to our programming. However, with the switch from analog to digital signals, followed by the fire in our offices, followed by the relocation to the Center for Public Media, we intentionally delayed adding WNIT InFocus to our station until the dust settled, literally. Our new channel configuration allows WNIT to broadcast both the best in PBS programs coupled with a variety of regional and statewide telecasts. It's the same great programs in slightly different packages, and we hope the new designations will cause no more than minimal difficulties for our viewers.

It's well over six months now since WNIT moved into the Center for Public Media, and we are delighted to be here. If you haven't had the opportunity to visit the new station, please call and arrange for a tour. The Community Room is available as meeting space for businesses, organizations and clubs. During the fall, the nine-part *Lunch & Learn* series met there weekly and more recently, *Shakespeare at Notre Dame* held its Regional Shakespeare Competition in our facilities. The Community Room seats up to 75 persons and has a wide range of audio and visual capabilities.

It's a new year, filled with excitement and promise. We hope you will join us on our journey through the magic arena of public television. **WNIT – serving Michiana with the Center for Public Media.**

WHAT'S WHAT???

Effective January 10, 2011

WNIT 34.1 is our primary 24-hour channel that features such favorites as Lawrence Welk, British comedies, Masterpiece Classic, NOVA and Nature. It is also the home for WNIT's line-up of locally produced programs, including *Dinner and a Book*, *Outdoor Elements*, *Economic Outlook*, *Politically Speaking* and *Ask an Expert*. 34.1 is carried on the basic tier of all local cable and satellite providers. Programs on 34.1 may be broadcast in either high or standard definition.

WNIT InFocus 34.2 is also broadcast 24 hours a day in either high or standard definition. WNIT InFocus carries a blend of such PBS features as *Frontline* and *Independent Lens* coupled with programs that feature state and regional topics of interest, such as *Indiana Week*, *Inside Indiana Business*, *Indiana Expeditions*, *Across Indiana* and *Indiana Lawmakers*. Area cable and satellite providers carry WNIT InFocus on their higher tiers for an additional fee. Please contact your service provider for channel placement on the system you use.



JANUARY 2 – “AMERICAN EAGLE”

Unique to North America, the bald eagle is the continent’s most recognizable aerial predator. Photographed by Emmy-winning cinematographer Neil Rettig, NATURE “American Eagle” tells the story of a year in the lives of these majestic raptors on a breathtaking stretch of the Mississippi.

JANUARY 16 – “WHITE FALCON, WHITE WOLF”

The film follows the perilous parenthood of two species – white gyrfalcons and Arctic wolves – on Canada’s remote Ellesmere Island, where winter lasts nine months and raising young in such a hostile environment is a daily struggle.

ROBERT E. LEE: AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

Robert E. Lee is celebrated by handsome equestrian statues in countless cities and towns across the American South and by no less than five postage stamps issued by the government he fought against during

the four bloodiest years in American history. Nearly a century and a half after his death, Robert E. Lee, the leading Confederate general of the American Civil War, remains a source of fascination and, for some, veneration.

JANUARY 4 – “KILLER SUBS IN PEARL HARBOR”

NOVA joins an exclusive dive beneath the waters of Pearl Harbor to trace new clues to the historic sinking of the USS Arizona. 1,177 crewmembers perished in the dramatic 1941 sinking of the storied battleship – the greatest loss of life in United States naval history. For decades, it has been thought that the Arizona was brought down by fire from Japanese aircraft. But the discovery of a Japanese “midget sub” far from the scene of the battle raises new questions about the Arizona’s final hours.

JANUARY 11 – “DEADLIEST EARTHQUAKE”

In 2010, epic earthquakes all over the planet delivered one of the worst annual death tolls ever recorded. The deadliest

Barely a month after the Haiti quake, Chile was struck by a quake 100 times more powerful, unleashing a tsunami that put the entire Pacific coast on high alert.

MASTERS OF THE ARCTIC ICE

The Arctic is the largest expanse of frozen water on the planet. All creatures that make their home there are masters of survival, superbly adapted to the Arctic ice. But climate change has begun to eat away at the ice on which these creatures depend. Two teams of researchers are racing to find out how global warming is rocking the Arctic world – before there’s nothing left but water.



Called “the most natural and least self-conscious screen actor that has ever lived” by über-critic Pauline Kael, this 2010 Oscar-winning best actor embodies traits far beyond brilliance as an actor. He is an exceptional musician, a photographer, an occasional vintner and a storyteller. He hails from an illustrious Hollywood family, working as a child with his father Lloyd and brother Beau on television’s “Sea Hunt.”

“THE DOORS: WHEN YOU’RE STRANGE”

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 12, 9:30PM

The creative chemistry of four brilliant artists – drummer John Densmore, guitarist Robby Krieger, keyboardist Ray Manzarek and singer Jim Morrison – made The Doors one of America’s most iconic and influential, theatrical and mysterious, thrilling and sometimes frightening rock bands. This, the first feature documentary

to tell their story, uses only original footage – much of it previously unseen – shot between the group’s formation in 1965 and Morrison’s death in 1971.

BREAKFAST SPECIAL is a celebration of going out for a morning meal in America. DINOSAUR WARS: AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

In the summer of 1868, paleontologist Othniel Charles Marsh boarded a Union Pacific train for a sightseeing excursion through the heart of the newly opened American West. Marsh soon realized he was traveling through the greatest dinosaur burial ground of all time. Ruthless, jealous and insanely competitive, Marsh would wrestle over the discovery with the other

leading paleontologist of his generation, Edward Drinker Cope. Over time, the two rivals would uncover the remains of 130 species of dinosaur, provide ample evidence to prove Charles Darwin’s hotly disputed theory of evolution and put American science on the world stage.

PIONEERS OF TELEVISION

JANUARY 18 – “SCIENCE FICTION”

Storytellers Gene Roddenberry, Irwin Allen and Rod Serling created the storylines and characters behind the best-loved futuristic television of their time. But as Roddenberry’s “Star Trek” competed for ratings with Allen’s “Lost in Space,” each show’s creator aimed for a very different direction. Featuring William Shatner, Leonard Nimoy, Nichelle Nichols and other science-fiction stars.

JANUARY 25 – “WESTERNS”

Westerns gave viewers James Garner, who starred in “Maverick.” Linda Evans recalls how two strong female characters emerged with her onscreen interaction with Barbara Stanwyck in “The Big Valley.” This episode also examines the success of Robert Conrad in “The Wild Wild

KILLER STRESS: A NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC SPECIAL

Stress. It’s always been there to save our lives. It’s what made us run from predators and enabled us to take down prey. PANAMA CANAL: AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

MONDAY, JANUARY 24, 9PM

On August 15, 1914, the Panama Canal opened, connecting the world’s two largest oceans and signaling America’s emergence as a global superpower. American ingenuity and innovation had succeeded where, just a few years earlier, the French had failed disastrously. But the U.S. paid a price for victory: more than a decade of ceaseless, grinding toil, an outlay of more than \$350 million — the largest single federal expenditure in history to that time — and the loss of more than 5,000 lives.

THE GREELY EXPEDITION: AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

MONDAY, JANUARY 31, 9PM

In 1881, 25 men led by Lieutenant Adolphus Greely sailed from the harbor of St. John’s, Newfoundland. Their destination was Lady Franklin Bay in the high Arctic, where they planned to collect a wealth of scientific data from a vast area of the world’s surface that had been described by a British admiral as a “sheer blank.” Three years later, only six survivors returned, with a daunting story of shipwreck, starvation, mutiny and cannibalism.

CHAUTAUQUA: AN AMERICAN NARRATIVE

MONDAY, JANUARY 31, 10PM

CHAUTAUQUA: AN AMERICAN NARRATIVE traces the Chautauqua Institution’s history and impact, and captures its contemporary essence and energy. From a NASA engineer, a former U.S. Supreme Court Justice, renowned authors, scholars and performers, learn what still makes Chautauqua one of the most distinctive summer destinations in America.

PIONEERS OF TELEVISION

TUESDAYS, FEBRUARY 1-22, 8PM

“CRIME DRAMAS”

As viewers reveled in being transported to shadowy underworlds, creative geniuses emerged in the forms of Jack Webb (“Dragnet”), Desi Arnaz (“The Untouchables”) and Bruce Geller (“Mannix” and “Mission: Impossible”). Groundbreaking actors Bill Cosby (“I Spy”) and Angie Dickinson (“Police Woman”) reveal the methods behind their successes as the first African-American and breakthrough female lead characters in a television series. Also features “Columbo” and “The Rockford Files.”

“LOCAL KIDS’ TV”

In the early years of television, local kids’ programs shaped the childhoods of millions of American children. Performers such as Willard Scott, Ernest Borgnine and William Shatner all honed their skills performing on live TV with small budgets and little support. With the flimsiest of second-hand store costumes and their own imaginations, they learned how to make their audience laugh, smile and think.

“LATE NIGHT”

The stories of Steve Allen, Jack Paar and Johnny Carson headline this episode about the formative years of late-night television. Merv Griffin also emerges as a key player on the late-night scene. Dick Cavett and Arsenio Hall also discuss their years in the mix, and Sigourney Weaver offers personal details about her father, Pat — the creator of “Tonight.”

“SITCOMS”

This episode focuses on five key sitcoms: “I Love Lucy,” “The Honeymooners,” “Make Room for Daddy,” “The Andy Griffith Show” and “The Dick Van Dyke Show.” Andy Griffith offers forceful opinions about the people and techniques that made his show work. In a rare occurrence, both Mary Tyler Moore and Dick Van Dyke recount their years on “The Dick Van Dyke Show.” Hundreds of episodes were culled for the most entertaining clips — including one particularly side-splitting bit by Don Knotts.

“CRASH OF FLIGHT 447”

On June 1, 2009, Flight AF447, an Air France Airbus A330 flying from Rio de Janeiro to Paris, disappeared over the Atlantic Ocean, taking with it all 228 lives on board. How could a state-of-the-art airliner with elaborate electronic safety and navigation features and a faultless safety record simply vanish without a trace?

FEBRUARY 16, 10PM 
“THE DEADLIEST PLANE CRASH”

NOVA presents a gripping investigation of what went wrong when two Boeing 747 airliners collided in thick fog on the runway at a tiny airport in the Canary Islands, killing 583 passengers and crew — the worst loss of life in any air disaster. With heart-breaking survivor interviews, re-enactments and a detective story approach, NOVA pieces together the clues that led to a fatal take-off decision by the highly experienced captain of the KLM 747, who couldn't see the Pan Am 747 still parked on the runway, lost in the fog ahead of him.

FEBRUARY 23, 9PM
“VENOM: NATURE’S KILLER”

Venom scientists are in a race against time. Inside the bodies of many creatures, evolution has produced extremely toxic cocktails, all designed for one reason: to kill. It took millions of years to perfect these ultimate brews of proteins and peptides, and we have only just begun to discover their potential. But nature's most destructive and extreme poisons could contain the building blocks for a new generation of advanced drugs that could treat heart attack, stroke, diabetes, obesity and cancer.

Seen for the first time are extraordinary 8mm home movies shot by Cooke from 1933 onwards, charting his discovery of America, his passions and his relationships with stars such as Paulette Goddard and Charlie Chaplin. Told in his own voice and in interviews with family and close friends — including MASTERPIECE executive producer Rebecca Eaton — the program is a chance to see America as Cooke first saw it: the raw material for a lifetime of journalism.

protected tiger reserves. But suddenly and without warning, Broken Tail abandoned his sanctuary and went on the run moving through farmland and scrub until he was killed by a train nearly 200 miles from its home.

Those within Ronald Reagan’s inner circle recognized Nancy Reagan as much more than the supportive and stylish spouse who redecorated the White House. She is credited with moving President Reagan to a more moderate position toward the Soviet Union and getting her husband to publically admit his involvement in Iran-Contra, a move that likely saved his presidency.
