You may know that PBS sets the gold standard for production of children's programming. What you may not know is just what is involved in earning that distinction. As described in the "PBS Producer Guidelines for Children's Content," in addition to high production and entertainment values, PBS children's content is distinguished by its solid educational value. Across its schedule, PBS seeks to provide two to eight year old viewers with engaging and age-appropriate content covering all aspects of child development and early learning – social, emotional, cognitive, physical and language development. All PBS children's programs

- must have explicit age-appropriate educational goals
- make use of child development and early learning research and best practices
- are required to include early childhood education consultants and advisors as ongoing members of the production team
- are encouraged to provide related educational outreach materials that can be used directly by children and their parents and teachers working with children at home and at school.

In addition, PBS children's programs avoid mean-spirited storylines that could threaten a child's sense of well-being. They forbid gratuitous physical and physiological violence, dangerous or illegal behaviors and vulgar or obscene language. The programs are sensitive to matters of race, color, ethnicity, disabilities, religion, gender, sexual orientation and social class.

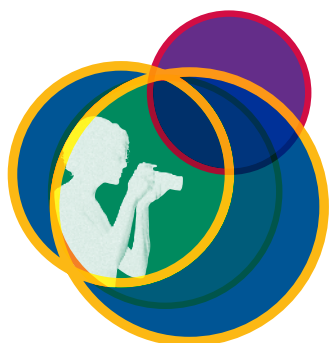
These are rigorous guidelines and they are rigorously applied. In addition to meeting the letter of the stated goals and objectives, PBS children's programs comply with the spirit of these rules, which means they treat children with joy and respect. PBS children's programs treat children as children, not as potential consumers to be manipulated or future voters to be influenced. Is it any wonder that PBS children's programs are consistently rated by parents and teachers as the most trusted source of children's programs in the country?

It is very much in keeping with this standard of excellence that PBS recently led the industry by earning 57 daytime Emmy nominations. In its 38th Annual Daytime Entertainment nominations, the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences selected PBS children's programs such as "Curious George," "Dinosaur Train," "Sid the Science Kid," "The Electric Company," "FETCH! With Ruff Ruffman," "Between the Lions," "Sesame Street," "The Cat in the Hat Knows a Lot About That!" "Martha Speaks," "WordGirl" and "Arthur."

WHAT'S WHAT???

WNIT 34.1 is our primary 24-hour channel that features such favorites as Lawrence Welk, British comedies, Masterpiece Classic, NOVA and Nature. It is also the home for WNIT's line-up of locally produced programs, including *Dinner and a Book*, *Outdoor Elements*, *Economic Outlook*, *Politically Speaking* and *Ask an Expert*. 34.1 is carried on the basic tier of all local cable and satellite providers. Programs on 34.1 may be broadcast in either high or standard definition.

WNIT InFocus 34.2 is also broadcast 24 hours a day in standard definition. WNIT InFocus carries a blend of such PBS features as *Frontline* and *Independent Lens* coupled with programs that feature state and regional topics of interest, such as *Indiana Week*, *Inside Indiana Business*, *Indiana Expeditions*, *Across Indiana* and *Indiana Lawmakers*. Area cable and satellite providers carry WNIT InFocus on their higher tiers for an additional fee. Please contact your service provider for channel placement on the system you use.

WNIT's Our Town: Warsaw-Winona Lake is a one-hour video documentary featuring the people, places and happenings of Warsaw-Winona Lake as experienced by those who call the community "home." The program will air on Sunday, August 21 as part of WNIT's August Membership Campaign.

With a little training from WNIT's professional, award winning production team, ordinary citizens became volunteer videographers. Armed with their own home camcorders, they created a video scrapbook of the stories that make Winona Lake and Warsaw special. There were no restrictions as to the adult age or experience of the

volunteer and no cost to participate ... just a willingness to be part of the project.

When the shooting was complete, WNIT's professional staff then utilized these video recordings, along with the interviews done by WNIT's producers with the volunteer videographers, to professionally edit the stories and produce a one-hour documentary that reflects the emotional ties of the people who live, love and are passionate about Our Town: Warsaw - Winona Lake.

A special preview event for volunteers and their guests will be held prior to the broadcast date.

“OCEANS IN GLASS: BEHIND THE SCENES OF THE MONTEREY BAY AQUARIUM” – JULY 10

Thanks to its realistic presentations, the Monterey Bay Aquarium is recognized as one of the most significant and spectacular aquariums in the world. Instead of exhibiting collections of animals, the aquarium presents entire habitats, virtual slices of ocean that include 30,000 animals and plants. There is one animal in particular whose presence is drawing world-wide attention – a great white shark.

“THE CHEETAH ORPHANS” – JULY 24

Veteran filmmaker Simon King takes on the role of mother to two cheetah cubs, Toki and Sambu, orphaned when their

mother was killed by a lion. It's a two-year emotional rollercoaster, from terrifying stand-offs with rhinos and leopards to some of the most intimate moments of cheetah life ever captured on film. The cubs evolve into sleek hunters, spending more and more time on their own.

“THE PALE HORSE”

Julia McKenzie is back as Agatha Christie's detective with a gentle smile and probing mind in the all-new episode “The Pale Horse.” Miss Marple's old friend is found murdered, and when she receives a list of names sent by the victim before his death, Miss Marple seeks justice.

“ZEN”

SUNDAYS, JULY 17-31, 9PM

“VENDETTA”

JULY 17

A killer is on a vendetta-fuelled rampage against those who wrongly imprisoned him, including a cop who had almost nothing to do with it: Zen. But Zen is too busy dealing with another crime – a politically-charged murder – to notice that he's on the psychopath's hit list.



Masterpiece Mystery! Agatha Christie's Miss Marple

“CABAL”

JULY 24

A disgraced aristocrat jumps off a bridge. Or was he pushed? As usual, Zen gets mixed signals from his scheming bosses: the Ministry of Justice wants a ruling of suicide, while a powerful and beautiful female prosecutor hints that Zen had better start looking for the murderer. The plot thickens when it appears that the victim was trying to inform on a previously unknown group called the Cabal, with conspirators at the highest levels of Italian society.

ANTIQUES ROADSHOW

MONDAYS, 8PM

“CHATTANOOGA” (HOUR ONE) – JULY 11

Reenactors fire a mid-nineteenth-century cannon at the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park to punctuate a discussion of collecting antique cannon artillery. Discoveries include: an 1826 Tennessee hunting horn; a Regency cellarette once owned by the poet Lord Byron; and an heirloom necklace whose centerpiece is a five carat diamond, valued at \$250,000.

“SAN ANTONIO” (Hour Two) – JULY 11

In San Antonio, Texas, **ANTIQUES ROADSHOW** visits the Witte Museum’s collection of horn furniture, a Bavarian craft popularized by nineteenth-century Texas furniture maker Wenzel Friedrich, whose patrons included Queen Victoria and Kaiser Wilhelm I. Highlights include: a controversial silver statue of St. Catherine; a two-hundred-year-old heirloom needlepoint sampler; and a massive desk and bookcase.

“SPOKANE, WA” (Hour Two) – JULY 25

In Spokane, Washington, **ANTIQUES ROADSHOW** looks at examples of a charming Victorian lighting fixture: the fairy lamp. At the Spokane Convention Center, appraisers brighten at the sight of such enchanting finds as a collection of pottery by 20th-century master ceramicists Otto and Gertrude Natzler; a moving landscape painting by early 20th-century artist Sydney Laurence; and an heirloom Waltham railroad pocket watch with a rare winding mechanism and diamond end stone.

AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

**ABRAHAM AND MARY LINCOLN,
A HOUSE DIVIDED
MONDAYS, JULY 11-25, 10PM**

“SHATTERED” JULY 11

When the Lincolns arrive in Washington in 1861, the country is breaking apart. The country’s president-elect is unknown, untested and mistrusted. His wife, the daughter of a Southern slave owner, is suspected of being a Confederate sympathizer. As Abraham leads a confused and frightened people through the most terrible conflict in their history, disaster strikes his own home: Willie Lincoln — the child Mary says will be “the hope and stay” of her old age — dies.

“THE DEAREST OF ALL THINGS” JULY 18

Tormented by grief and losing grip on sanity, Mary Lincoln turns to spiritualists for comfort. With the war going badly, enlistments drying up and morale low, Abraham Lincoln takes a step that changes the country forever and, in doing so, he changes himself. On January 1, 1863, the president issues the Emancipation Proclamation, liberating millions of Americans from bondage. The

move turns the Civil War from a conflict over union into a struggle for freedom.

“THE FRIGHTFUL WAR” JULY 25

As 1863 begins, it seems the Civil War will never end. One-hundred Union soldiers desert daily and hundreds more die of disease. Some Northerners resent fighting to free black slaves; others are furious with Abraham Lincoln for the devastating Union casualties. Mary Lincoln, worried about her husband, spends money compulsively, plunging herself into terrible debt.

JEAN-MICHAEL COUSTEAU: OCEAN ADVENTURES

“SEA GHOSTS” WEDNESDAY, JULY 13, 10PM

In the cold Arctic waters of the far north, the sea is alive with the sound of beluga whales. They’re an evolutionary surprise – a warm-blooded mammal in a numbingly cold sea. Jean-Michel Cousteau travels to the high Arctic to determine why some beluga groups are thriving and others are disappearing. The beluga’s world is now ground zero for climate change; what threatens them is not confined to the Arctic – it’s global. What lies ahead for the beluga could become prophecy for many species everywhere, including our own.

SECRETS OF THE DEAD

"LOST IN THE AMAZON"

WEDNESDAY, JULY 20, 8PM

A modern day quest to find the truth behind one of exploration's greatest mysteries: What happened to famed adventurer Col. Percy Fawcett who went looking for a city of gold – the Lost City of "Z" – in the Amazon in 1925 and disappeared in the jungles of Brazil forever? The program shares surprising finds that are causing experts to re-think the image of a pristine uninhabited Amazon rainforest: a place that before Columbus, may have had large populations living in sophisticated towns and cities.

"AZTEC MASSACRE"

Throughout recent times, historians have believed that when the Spanish conquistadors arrived in Aztec territory in the 15th century, they were welcomed as returning light-skinned gods by the Aztecs, who put up little resistance to their conquest. This program paints a new picture of the violent relations between the Aztecs and the conquistadors and rewrites much of what we thought we knew about the Aztec civilization.

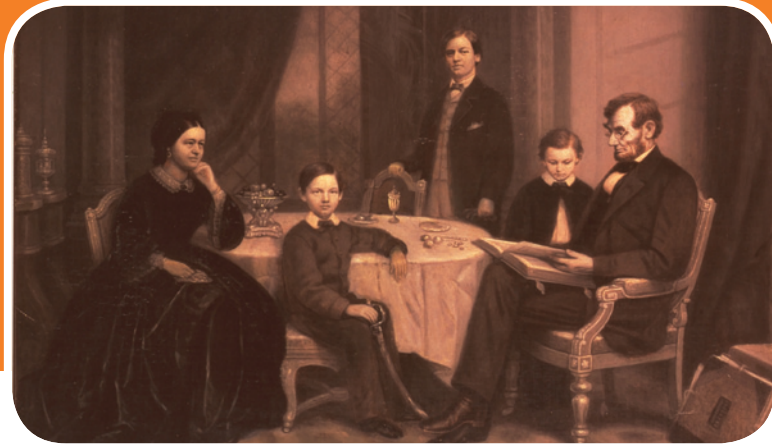

American Experience: Abraham and Mary Lincoln, A House Divided

ANTIQUES ROADSHOW

MONDAYS, 8PM

"GRAND RAPIDS" (Hour One)
AUGUST 1

ANTIQUES ROADSHOW drives to the Gilmore Car Museum near Grand Rapids, Michigan, for a look at their collection of more than 1500 hood ornaments or "mascots." Highlights include: a letter from Grand Rapids native son, Gerald Ford, written in 1967 to his former kindergarten teacher; a pair of earrings made from cufflinks given to the guest's grandfather by Czar Nicholas II of Russia; and an 1881 painting by noted Hudson River School artist Jasper Cropsey, valued at \$300,000.

"LOUISVILLE" (Hour Two)
AUGUST 22

Highlights include: a rare, circa 1910 Dirk Van Erp lamp, originally bought for about \$100; an exceptionally well-preserved 1876 portrait Jumeau doll with all original parts, except her hair; and a fortunate Kentucky corner cupboard—at one time destined to be burned and thrown away—made of locally grown wood and valued at \$8,500.

"LAS VEGAS" (Hour Two)
AUGUST 29

Drawings by the legendary folk musician Woody Guthrie, given to the owner's journalist father after an interview with Guthrie; an heirloom early-nineteenth-century tavern clock made by Aaron Willard of the renowned Boston clock manufacturing family; and a fabulous five-carat, Asscher-cut diamond ring, inherited from the owner's grandfather, and valued at \$165,000 to \$175,000.

AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

**ABRAHAM AND MARY LINCOLN,
A HOUSE DIVIDED**
"BLIND WITH WEeping"

MONDAY, AUGUST 1, 10PM

This episode tells the story of the last 16 months of war — the battle of Gettysburg, the Union victory that changed the conflict's course, and Abraham Lincoln's battlefield dedication that changed America's conception of itself. With the surrender at Appomattox and the Civil War finally over, the president tells Mary Lincoln they can find some happiness again. Just days later, he is shot to death.

DELIVERING ON THE PROMISE

When Newsweek magazine published an article which included South Bend in its list of Ten Cities “with bleak futures ahead,” WNIT decided to face the issue head on. In February of this year, we produced a one-hour, live town hall style program entitled, “**South Bend: Thriving or Dying?**” With a panel of six local experts and an audience of about 75, the program addressed key issues facing South Bend – schools, jobs, crime, housing, recreation and transportation.

On June 9, WNIT produced the second in this series, “**Michiana: Open for Business.**” The one-hour, live program

was again co-hosted by Gary Sieber and Kelly Morgan and focused on area business development. It featured 20 owners and CEOs of Michiana businesses and organizations as it probed the strengths and weaknesses of our region’s economic development.

One area cited in the Newsweek article was the decline in South Bend population among the under-18 age category, so WNIT decided to ask 25 young adults about the pros and cons of living and working in this community.

"BrainGames" is presented as a game show with three teams per episode competing to win. In the fourth and final program,

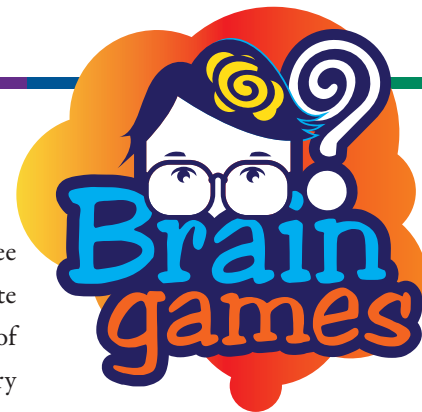
