




WNIT 34.1 is our primary 24-hour channel that features such favorites as Lawrence Welk, British comedies, Masterpiece Classic, NOVA and Nature. It is also the home for WNIT's line-up of locally produced programs, including *Dinner and a Book*, *Outdoor Elements*, *Economic Outlook*, *Politically Speaking* and *Ask an Expert*. 34.1 is carried on the basic tier of all local cable and satellite providers. Programs on 34.1 may be broadcast in either high or standard definition.

WNIT InFocus 34.2 is also broadcast 24 hours a day in standard definition. WNIT InFocus carries a blend of such PBS features as *Frontline* and *Independent Lens* coupled with programs that feature state and regional topics of interest, such as *Indiana Week*, *Inside Indiana Business*, *Indiana Expeditions*, *Across Indiana* and *Indiana Lawmakers*. Area cable and satellite providers carry WNIT InFocus on their higher tiers for an additional fee. Please contact your service provider for channel placement on the system you use.

Eighteenth Amendment – Prohibition of Intoxicating Liquors

Its ratification was certified on January 16, 1919.

Section 1. After one year from the ratification of this article the manufacture, sale, or transportation of intoxicating liquors within, the importation thereof into, or the exportation thereof from the United States and all territory subject

to the jurisdiction thereof for beverage purposes is hereby prohibited.

Section 2. The Congress and the several States shall have concurrent power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

Twenty-first Amendment – Repealing the Eighteenth Amendment

Passed by Congress February 20, 1933.
Ratified December 5, 1933.


Section 1. The Eighteenth article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States is hereby repealed.

THE HAYLOFT GANG: THE STORY OF THE NATIONAL BARN DANCE THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 8PM



One of the most popular and long-running programs on radio was the “National Barn Dance.” Debuting in 1924, the show blended music, comedy and down-home theatrical skits. Preceding the success of the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville by nearly two decades, “National Barn Dance” was the flagship, setting the standard for hundreds of radio barn dances across the country. The program served two audiences — the rural farm audiences and city listeners who had come from these communities and wanted to remember the “good old days.” Garrison Keillor narrates.

NATURE SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 8PM “REVEALING THE LEOPARD”

Leopards are the ultimate cat. They are the most feline, the most intelligent, the most dangerous and, until recently, one of the least understood. They hunt from South Africa to Siberia, from Arabia to Sri Lanka, and are the most widespread predator of their size on land.

A leopard is a cat that walks by itself, unseen and secretive. Leopards are the beautiful killers that live in the shadows. This film accumulates the evidence and puts together a psychological profile of this extraordinarily cunning cat.

MASTERPIECE MYSTERY! “INSPECTOR LEWIS, SERIES IV: OLD, UNHAPPY, FAR OFF THINGS” SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 9PM

Lewis and Hathaway are called in to investigate the poisoning of a bishop, who they suspect was murdered for her progressive views. As their investigation continues, they uncover a twisted maze of motives and retribution. Sian Phillips (MASTERPIECE “I, Claudius”) co-stars.

“INSPECTOR LEWIS, SERIES IV: THE MIND HAS MOUNTAINS” SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 25, 9PM

When a student is found dead during a clinical drug trial, the motives of an enigmatic professor are questioned. When a second death occurs, Lewis and Hathaway begin to suspect foul play, which the duo must uncover before another death occurs. Douglas Henshall (MASTERPIECE “South Riding,” “Collision”) co-stars.

FORGOTTEN ELLIS ISLAND **MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 10PM**

This is the first documentary about the abandoned immigrant hospital on Ellis Island. During the great wave of immigration, 22 medical buildings sprawled across two islands adjacent to Ellis Island, the largest port of entry to the United States. Massive and modern, the hospital was America's first line of defense against contagious, often virulent, disease. In the era before antibiotics, tens of thousands of immigrant patients were separated from family, detained in the hospital and healed from illness before becoming citizens. **FORGOTTEN ELLIS ISLAND** is a powerful tribute to the best — and worst — of America's dealings with its new citizens-to-be.

HISTORY DETECTIVES **TUESDAYS, 8PM**

"EPISODE #909" – SEPTEMBER 6

Loyalist or patriot? What can the notes in a 1775 Almanac tell us about how the revolution may have strained family ties? Do these phonograph records called "Get Thin to Music" reveal Jack Lalanne, the media exercise guru of the 1920s? Did NASA unwittingly transport Andy Warhol's art to the moon?

"EPISODE #910" – SEPTEMBER 20

How did a contributor's father earn the Order of Leopold, the highest military honor bestowed by the Belgian government? What can a Club Continental business card tell us about California's prohibition-era underground? NOVA **WEDNESDAYS, 9PM**

"ENGINEERING GROUND ZERO" **– SEPTEMBER 7**

On the tenth anniversary of 9/11, NOVA presents an epic story of engineering, innovation and the perseverance of the human spirit. "Engineering Ground Zero" follows the five-year construction of One World Trade Center (1 WTC) and the National September 11 Memorial & Museum. NOVA captures the

behind-the-scenes struggle of architects and engineers to make the buildings safe and secure under the pressures of a tight schedule, the demands of practical office space and efficient "green" architecture, and the public's expectations of a fitting site for national remembrance.

"JAPAN'S KILLER QUAKE" **– SEPTEMBER 28**

In its worst crisis since World War II, Japan faces disaster on an epic scale: a rising death toll of the tens of thousands, massive destruction of home and businesses, shortages of water and power, and the specter of nuclear reactor meltdowns. The March 11 earthquake was the world's fourth largest and the worst ever to shake Japan. The tsunami slammed Japan's coast with 30 feet high waves that traveled six miles inland, obliterating entire towns in a matter of minutes.

SURVIVING THE TSUNAMI: **A NOVA SPECIAL PRESENTATION** **SEPTEMBER 28, 10PM**

The earthquake that hit the northern coast of Japan on March 11, 2011 was recorded at magnitude 9.0, the worst ever to strike Japan, and it generated an unprecedented tsunami. Amazingly, amateur and professional photographers captured it all on video, including remarkable

TENTH ANNIVERSARY

SEPTEMBER 11, 8PM

PBS NEWSHOUR presents a one-hour special broadcast commemorating the 10th anniversary of the attacks of September 11, 2001. The PBS NEWSHOUR team will examine the significance of the day in many different communities across the nation, including the three major memorial observances at Ground Zero in New York City, at the Pentagon near Washington, DC, and in rural Shanksville, Pennsylvania. Judy Woodruff introduces viewers to a generation of young Americans who know only a post-9/11 world.

BETTY FORD: THE REAL DEAL

In Betty Ford's brief and unexpected reign as First Lady, she broke the mold. She was a pro-choice Republican who became the first First Lady to take on a feminist agenda and differ publicly with her husband. The first divorced First Lady, Mrs. Ford was a career woman who danced with the Martha Graham dance troupe.

She and her husband loved to throw parties and open up the White House. Her ability to be open and honest about her battles with breast cancer and drug and alcohol abuse saved millions of lives.

A riveting segment reveals the difficulties of replicating the human brain in machines like IBM's "Watson." In this third program about communities standing up against hate crimes, the story is set in Patchogue, New York, an ethnically diverse working-class village in Suffolk County. In 2008, a series of attacks against Latino residents ended with the killing of an Ecuadoran immigrant who had lived in the village for 13 years. Seven local high school students arrested for the crime admitted they were “looking for a Mexican” to beat up.



PROHIBITION – KEN BURNS

“A NATION OF DRUNKARDS”

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 2, 8PM AND 10PM

Since the early years of the American Republic, alcohol has been embedded in the fabric of American culture. As a wave of spiritual fervor for reform sweeps the country, many women and men begin to see alcohol as a scourge and the temperance campaign ignites. Spearheaded by the Woman’s Christian Temperance Union, the Anti-Saloon League (ASL) forms to push for an amendment to the Constitution outlawing alcohol nationally.

“A NATION OF SCOFFLAWS”

MONDAY, OCTOBER 3, 8PM AND 10PM

In 1920, Prohibition goes into effect, making it illegal to manufacture, transport or sell intoxicating liquor. While a significant portion of the country is willing to adapt to the new law, others are shocked at how inconsistent the Volstead Act actually is. As weaknesses in the law and its enforcement become clear, millions find ways to exploit it. Despite the growing discontent with Prohibition and its consequences, few politicians dare to speak out against the law, fearful of its powerful protector, the Anti-Saloon League.

“A NATION OF HYPOCRITES”

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 4, 8PM AND 10PM

Support for Prohibition diminishes in the mid-1920s as the playfulness of sneaking around for a drink gives way to disenchantment with its glaring unintended consequences. By criminalizing one of the nation’s largest industries, the law has given savvy gangsters a way to make huge profits, and as they grow in power, rival outfits wreak havoc in cities across the country. After the election of Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1932, Congress easily passes the 21st Amendment, which repeals the 18th, and the states quickly ratify it. In December of 1933, Americans can legally buy a drink for the first time in 13 years.

“BUILDING THE GREAT CATHEDRALS”

Carved from a hundred million pounds of stone, soaring effortlessly atop a spider web of masonry, Gothic cathedrals are marvels of human achievement and artistry. But how did medieval builders reach such spectacular heights? NOVA’s teams perform hands-on experiments to investigate and reveal the architectural secrets that the cathedral builders used to erect their soaring, glass-filled walls.

“FINDING LIFE BEYOND EARTH”

– OCTOBER 19

Scientists are on the verge of answering one of the greatest questions in history: Are we alone? Combining the latest telescope images with dazzling CGI, “Finding Life Beyond Earth” immerses audiences in the sights and sounds of alien worlds, while top astrobiologists explain how these places are changing how we think about the potential for life in our solar system. If we do find primitive life forms elsewhere in the solar system, it may well be that life is common in the universe — the rule, and not the exception.

ANTIQUES ROADSHOW kicks off its visit to Milwaukee, Wisconsin, at the city’s traditional German Fest, where host Mark L. Walberg and appraiser Stuart Whitehurst soak up the atmosphere and talk about collectible German beer steins. At the Midwest Airlines Center, collectors are thirsty for information about such treasures as a 1952 Fender Esquire guitar; a late 19th-century child’s sled in the shape of a swan; and an 18th-century desk and bookcase passed down to the owner from his great-grandfather that could be worth as much as \$250,000.

“I CAME TO TESTIFY” – OCTOBER 11

This is the moving story of how a group of 16 women who had been imprisoned and raped by Serb-led forces in the Bosnian town of Foca broke history’s great silence and stepped forward to take the witness stand in an international court of law. Their remarkable courage resulted in a triumphant verdict that led to new international laws about sexual violence in war.

“PRAY THE DEVIL BACK TO HELL”



The second episode tells the astonishing story of the Liberian women who took on the warlords and regime of dictator Charles Taylor in the midst of a brutal civil war and won a once unimaginable peace for their shattered country in 2003. In the capital city of Monrovia, thousands of women — mothers, grandmothers, aunts and daughters, both Christian and Muslim — formed a thin but unshakable line between the opposing forces.

“PEACE UNVEILED” – OCTOBER 25

When the U.S. troop surge was announced in late 2009, women in Afghanistan knew that the ground was being laid for peace talks with the Taliban. “Peace Unveiled” follows three women who immediately began to organize to make sure that women have a seat at the negotiating table. Convinced that the Taliban will make demands that jeopardize women’s hard-earned gains, they maneuver against formidable odds to have their voices heard in a peace jirga and high peace council.

The Power of 100

WNIT's newest documentary, **The Power of 100: The Story of the 100 Black Men of South Bend**, follows the creation of the South Bend chapter of the 100 Black Men of America. Our cameras explore the mentoring processes as well as meet, up close and personal, many of the members as well as the children they mentor.

Many of the children featured in the documentary are raised by single moms who do their best to provide for their children. It's an uphill battle. Drugs, gangs, bad influences, all vie for the attention of their kids. That's where the "100" comes in. These stand-out citizens from South Bend range from career professionals to successful businessmen and everyday citizens who have had great successes in their lives. Many of them have also overcome the same situations as these young mentees face today.



WNIT was invited into the homes, businesses and the Freeman Academy where we were allowed to observe and document the mentoring process and meet many of the members of the "100" in action. Even more compelling, our cameras were invited to the homes

of the children to meet their moms, as well as their brothers, sisters and friends.

Additionally, our young mentees shared their lives with their own recordings on mini DV cams. They videotaped their lives, showing us their families and friends, the neighborhoods where they live and the places they hangout. We learned of their challenges, the essential skills needed to achieve their own success and how their mentors play a role in their lives.

The Power of 100: The Story of the 100 Black Men of South Bend is an inspirational story. More than that, it is also a tool, showing how a systematic approach to good counseling, good mentoring and proper motivation can be effective in helping today's young people overcome obstacles, prejudices and stereotypes (both internal and external) to become productive citizens and role models for generations to come.

The Power of 100 can be seen on 34.1 on Thursday, September 22 at 8pm and again on Sunday, October 2 at 7pm.


