We often say WNIT is PBS for Michiana, but what manner of organization is PBS? The Public Broadcasting Service (PBS) is a private, nonprofit corporation, founded in 1969, whose members are America's public TV stations – noncommercial, educational licensees that operate more than 350 PBS member stations and serve all 50 states, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam and American Samoa. Its president is Paula Kerger, who visited WNIT in June, 2007. Unlike commercial networks, PBS is a member-owned organization, serving the needs of its individual stations.


PBS' mission is to create content that educates, informs and inspires. To do this, PBS offers programming that expands the minds of children, documentaries that open up new worlds, non-commercialized news programs that keep citizens informed on world events, cultures and programs that expose America to the worlds of music, theater, dance and art. PBS and its member stations are America's largest classroom, the nation's largest stage for the arts and a trusted window to the world. In addition, PBS' educational media helps prepare children for success in school and opens up the world to them in an age-appropriate way.

PBS constantly seeks to address unmet needs of the American people. Today, the U.S. is in the midst of an age boom. The 50+ population in America has grown from 74 million in 1999 to more than 99 million today, and is projected to be 127 million in 2030. While part can be attributed to the sheer size of the boomer demographic, part is due to a dramatic increase in longevity – at the beginning of the 20th century, life expectancy was 49 years, and today it tops more than 80 years.

In response, the PBS system and WNIT Public Television introduced Next Avenue, an extensive new website launched on May 15. Designed to meet the needs and the potential of this age boom, Next Avenue seeks to engage, inspire and inform the more than 100 million people who are transitioning into what many see as a new life stage in human development – a stage between young adulthood and "old old." WNIT is also a member of the Indiana Public Broadcasting Stations (IPBS). Headed by Executive Director Roger Rhodes, IPBS provides support in areas such as education, arts and culture, tourism, economic development and public service.

WNIT Public Television is proud to be a member station of both PBS and IPBS. Together, we strive on a daily basis to inform, educate, inspire and entertain the viewers of Michiana.

## ON THE COVER

### OUR TOWN: MISHAWAKA

As the latest in the Our Town series, OUR TOWN: MISHAWAKA relates the story of Mishawaka as told by the people of Mishawaka. Its nickname "The Princess City" follows the legend that the city is named after Mishawaka, daughter of Shawnee Chief Elkhart. The story holds that the Shawnee were permitted to settle on Potawatomi lands in the late 18th century, and Potawatomi Chief Grey Wolf soon fell in love with Mishawaka. She rejected his advances and pledged her love to a white trapper, known only as Deadshot. After many trials and tribulations, Princess Mishawaka died in 1818 at age 32. She was supposedly buried near Lincoln Park, where a bronze marker there retells the legend.

Since its incorporation in 1833, Mishawaka has been home to many business and manufacturing concerns, including the luxurious American Simplex motor car, Dodge Manufacturing, the Mishawaka Woolen and Rubber Company, which became Ball Band and then Uniroyal, and AM General. University

Park Mall opened north of Mishawaka in 1979. In the late 19th century, Mishawaka was known as the "Peppermint Capital of the World," since the area's rich black loam produced great quantities of mint.

The city's population of 48,252 includes many descendants of Italian and Belgian immigrants. Older neighborhoods exist throughout the city, which lend community spirit and a "hometown" neighborhood feel. Because neighborhoods are such a vital resource to the success of Mishawaka, the city continually upgrades and develops new neighborhood park and recreation facilities.



### QUEEN & COUNTRY

SUNDAYS, JULY 1-22, 8PM

#### “LONDON: ROYAL CITY” – JULY 1

London is the capital of Britain's royal life. Here, Elizabeth and her sister, Margaret, mingled, incognito, with the joyous crowds on VE Day. It is still the center of a working monarchy. Join Trevor McDonald as he reports on the tradition of Changing the Guard at Buckingham Palace and visits Horseguards to meet the man who is in charge of the troops who guard the queen.

#### “ROYAL VISIT” – JULY 8

The Queen's year is driven by her diary — and has been since her accession in 1952. See her in Scotland at the Braemar Gathering (which she has attended 70 times) and follow her on a visit to Liverpool — the sort of regional trip that happens every week but attracts little publicity. View unique 3D footage of the young queen, shot in 1953 and held by the British Film Institute.

#### “THE QUEEN'S POSSESSIONS”

– JULY 15

The Queen has some surprising possessions. Among them are Westminster Abbey and the Chapels Royal — the “peculiar of the crown.” The queen also owns the Tower of London — part of a collection of Historic Royal Palaces and the Royal Collection, to which she has added nearly 150 portraits over the past six decades.

#### “TRAVELLER” – JULY 22

The queen is head of the 16 realms that make up the Commonwealth. In Perth, Western Australia, Queen Elizabeth is on tour before opening the Heads of Government Meeting, which is especially important for the monarchy. The Commonwealth countries are being asked to change the rules of succession so that a first-born girl may inherit the crown. If it's approved, it will be the single biggest change to the monarchy for centuries.

**“PEASANTS’ REVOLT AND THE BLACK DEATH” – JULY 3, 9PM**

Follow the story of Kibworth as it reaches the catastrophic 14th century. The village goes through the worst famine in European history, and then, two-thirds of the people die in the Black Death. Michael Wood follows stories of individual lives through these times, out of which the English idea of community and the English character begin to emerge.

**“THE SEEDS OF REFORM” – JULY 10, 8PM**

The story of Kibworth moves on to dramatic battles of conscience in the time of the Hundred Years’ War. Some villagers join in a rebellion against King Henry V, while others rise to become middle-class merchants in the textile town of Coventry. Kibworth experiences the dramatic events of Henry VIII’s Protestant Reformation and the battles of the English Civil War.

**“THE BIRTH OF MODERN ENGLAND” – JULY 17, 8PM**

The Industrial Revolution reaches the village with framework knitting factories. Helped by today’s residents, Michael Wood uncovers the secret history of a Victorian village, visits World War I battlefields and recalls life in World War II when the village was bombed. Lastly, see Kibworth as it is today — a growing, multicultural village.

**“A NECESSARY WAR”**

Inhabitants of four towns — Mobile, Alabama; Sacramento, California; Waterbury, Connecticut; and Luverne, Minnesota — recall their communities on the eve of the conflict.

In the Philippines, American and Filipino forces retreat onto Bataan. Back home, 110,000 Japanese Americans along the West Coast are forcibly relocated by the government to internment camps. In June 1942, the Navy defeats the Japanese at the Battle of Midway. In August, American land forces face the Japanese army for the first time at Guadalcanal. After six months, the Americans prevail and stop Japan’s expansion in the Pacific.

#### “WHITE FALCON, WHITE WOLF” – AUGUST 1

On Canada’s remote Ellesmere Island, where June is spring, July is summer and August is already autumn, the race is on for two remarkable species to raise their families. The white gyrfalcon is enormous, the largest and most powerful falcon in the world. Yet during the summer, the nesting falcon pair on the island failed to raise any young. The rare Arctic wolves rely on every member of the pack to chase and bring down the prey that keep them alive.

#### “FROGS: THE THIN GREEN LINE” – AUGUST 8

Frogs have been hopping the planet for more than 350 million years. They’ve evolved into some of the most wondrous, diverse and beloved animals on earth. Suddenly, they’re slipping away. We’ve already lost one-third of our amphibians and more are disappearing each day. Some say it’s the greatest extinction since the dinosaurs.

### THE WAR

#### “WHEN THINGS GET TOUGH” – AUGUST 1

By January 1943, Americans have been at war for more than a year. The Germans still occupy most of Western Europe; American troops are now ashore in North Africa. At Kasserine Pass, Erwin Rommel’s seasoned veterans quickly overwhelm the poorly led and ill-equipped Americans, but after George Patton assumes command, the Americans begin to beat back the Germans.

#### “A DEADLY CALLING” – AUGUST 2

Despite American victories in the Solomons and New Guinea, the Japanese empire still stretches 4,000 miles. African Americans, serving in the segregated armed forces, demand equal rights; the military reluctantly agrees to some changes. Japanese-American men, originally designated “enemy aliens,” are permitted to form a special segregated unit, the 442nd Regimental Combat Team. In Italy, Allied forces are stalled in the mountains south of Rome, unable to break through the German lines at Monte Cassino. On June 4, Allied soldiers liberate Rome.

#### “PRIDE OF OUR NATION” – AUGUST 5


On June 6, 1944, D-Day, a million and a half Allied troops embark on the invasion of France. German resistance ravages the American forces in the bloodiest day in American history since the Civil War. But the Allies succeed in tearing a 45-mile gap in Hitler’s vaunted Atlantic Wall. On August 25, after four years of Nazi occupation, Paris is liberated — and the end of the war in Europe seems only a few weeks away.

#### “FUBAR” – AUGUST 6

On the Western Front, Allied commanders gamble on a risky scheme to drop thousands of airborne troops behind enemy lines in Holland, but nothing goes according to plan. In the Pacific, General MacArthur is poised to invade the Philippines. The 1st Marine Division is ordered to take the nearby island of Peleliu. The fighting drags on for more than two months in one of the most brutal and unnecessary campaigns in the Pacific.

### “THE GHOST FRONT” – AUGUST 7

Hitler launches the Battle of the Bulge on December 16. At Yalta, Allied leaders agree on massive bombing raids aimed at German oil facilities, defense factories, roads, railways and cities. In March alone, Allied warplanes drop 163,864 tons of bombs on Germany — almost as many as they have dropped in the preceding three years combined. The air strip on Iwo Jima needs to be taken. There, the Marines face 21,000 determined Japanese defenders who have been ordered to kill as many Americans as possible before being killed themselves. By the middle of March 1945, hundreds of thousands of Americans are crossing the Rhine and driving into the heart of Germany, while the Russians are within 50 miles of Berlin.

### “A WORLD WITHOUT WAR” – AUGUST 8

In mid-April, Americans are shocked by President Roosevelt’s death; many do not even know the name of their new president, Harry Truman. Meanwhile, as Allied forces rapidly push across Germany, American and British troops discover for themselves the true horrors of the Nazi’s industrialized barbarism — at hundreds of concentration camps. Finally, on May 8, with their country in ruins and their fuhrer dead by his own hand, the Nazis surrender.

When the battle on Okinawa is finally over in June, 92,000 Japanese soldiers have been killed. Then, on August 6, 1945, an American plane drops a single atomic bomb on the city of Hiroshima, obliterating 40,000 men, women and children in an instant; 100,000 more die of burns and radiation within days. On August 9, a second American atomic bomb destroys the city of Nagasaki. The rulers of Japan at last give up.

Follow Dr. Albert Barnes’ remarkable rise from Philadelphia’s working-class neighborhood to the top of the modern art world. The late Dr. Barnes travels the world to collect works of art by some of history’s most famous artists — Picasso, Cezanne, Matisse, Renoir and many others. The film digs deep into the intricacies of each painting, offering a rare look at the priceless collection and the new Philadelphia museum that houses it.

## HISTORY DETECTIVES
