MARY'S MESSAGE

The fall season is alive with its own pattern of renewal and invention: children going back to school, football teams beginning their seasons, a new lineup of television programs across the dial, and – every four years – a major political election campaign.

As we enter the final months of campaigning for national and local elections, WNIT will be there to provide you with the most trusted programming (according to nine years of national polling data) in all of media, across the political and ideological spectrum.

This is consistent with what we do, every day of every year, as media dedicated to the public interest. In addition to providing the kinds of programs that help you be a better citizen, our programs also help the entire community in meaningful and important ways. We help parents, of all economic conditions, get their children ready to learn and succeed in school through programming like *Sesame Street*, *SuperWhy*, and *Curious George*. We help teachers, through PBS Learning Media, access media modules that enrich the teaching and learning experience in the classroom and improve student achievement, most at no cost. We help adult learners study for their GED. We introduce learners of all ages to the rich cultural environment of the arts, and help business leaders stay informed on policy and financial trends. And, we reflect the lives of Michiana citizens in our local programs like *Experience Michiana*, *Economic Outlook*, *Politically Speaking*, *Our Town Warsaw-Winona Lake*, and many others.

And we do all this with a mix of public and private funding sources that is often hailed as an example of a successful public-private partnership. Federal funding, at about \$1.37 per person per year, accounts for an average of 15% of funding for public broadcasting nationwide. In more rural areas, such as those served by WNIT, the ratio is higher due to population density factors: federal funding comprises about 25% of our annual budget; 75% of our funding comes from local and community sources. And public broadcasting has already taken 13% in federal cuts over the last two fiscal years, which is having a significant impact on the services we are able to provide to you.

Your membership and underwriting support is the backbone of our operation. However, it is all built on a foundation of federal funding that cannot be replaced through other means. The government's own GAO report in 2007 concluded that there is no viable alternative to federal funding for public broadcasting. It is what keeps the public voice in media.

During this fall season, we are all engaged in a national discussion about the role of government. You can depend on public media – broadcasting and online – to bring you the stories that matter to your understanding of the debate. Public media are depending on you to help assure that decisions about our public funding are part of that debate.

“WAGNER’S DREAM”

The stakes could not be higher as visionary director Robert Lepage, several of the world’s greatest operatic artists and the Metropolitan Opera tackle Wagner’s Ring cycle. An intimate look at the enormous theatrical and musical challenges of staging opera’s most monumental work, Susan Froemke’s documentary chronicles the quest to fulfill Wagner’s dream of a perfect Ring.

**“DAS RHEINGOLD
(THE RHINE GOLD)”**

In the first opera in the Ring cycle, the gods of Valhalla clash with underworld dwarves and brawny giants, with disastrous consequences. The evil Alberich steals gold from the Rhine and uses it to forge a ring of unimaginable power. Wotan, the king of the gods, uses magic to steal the ring, but Alberich places a curse that guarantees misery for whoever wears it.

“DIE WALKÜRE (THE VALKYRIE)”

The mysterious hero Siegmund finds shelter in the strangely familiar arms of a lonely woman named Sieglinde. Their forbidden love leads Wotan’s daughter, the warrior maiden Brünnhilde, to defy morality and intervene on behalf of the hero. Brünnhilde’s transgression forces her father to choose between his love for his favorite daughter and his duty to his wife, the formidable goddess Fricka.

“SIEGFRIED”

The young hero Siegfried grows up in the wilderness, raised by Alberich’s conniving brother Mime. He puts together the broken pieces of the sword Nothung, uses it to slay the fearsome dragon Fafner and takes the ring for himself. To fulfill his destiny, he must overcome one more opponent — Wotan, now disguised as the Wanderer, who knows the world of the gods is coming to an end — and cross through the magic fire to awaken his true love, Brünnhilde.

Heartbroken, Brünnhilde takes the ring and leaps into the hero’s funeral pyre, causing a global cataclysm and the twilight of the gods.

AMERICAN MASTERS: THE DAY CARL SANDBURG DIED

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 10PM

For much of the 20th century, Carl Sandburg was synonymous with the American experience, a spokesman on behalf of “the people.” Sandburg became one of the most successful writers in the English language: a three-time Pulitzer Prize-winner, biographer (most notably of Abraham Lincoln), children’s storyteller, novelist and captivating performer. AMERICAN MASTERS provides a dynamic examination into the life, work and controversy surrounding Sandburg and his contributions.

MONEY AND MEDICINE

Examine the medical, ethical and financial challenges of containing runaway healthcare spending. This moving, intimate, funny and true-to-life series, based on the best-selling memoirs of the late Jennifer Worth, tells colorful stories of midwifery and families in London’s East End in the 1950s. Jenny Lee, a young woman raised in the wealthy English countryside, has chosen to become a nurse and now, as a newly qualified midwife, has gone to work in the poorest area of the city.

EPISODE 1 – SEPTEMBER 30

In the spring of 1957, newly qualified midwife Jenny Lee arrives in the East End of London to begin her career. After overcoming the initial shock that her new home, Nonnatus House, is a convent and not a private hospital, she quickly becomes immersed in her new life. Through her, experience the sorrows and joys that come with being a midwife.

EPISODE 1 – 9PM

Sir Hallam and Lady Agnes Holland move into 165 Eaton Place and hire former parlor maid Rose to assemble a staff. The servants are soon put to the test during a party that threatens to destroy Sir Hallam’s career.

EPISODE 2 – 10PM

A German-Jewish refugee comes to 165 Eaton Place as a maid, prompting a range of reactions from upstairs and down. Her experiences culminate in a crisis tied to the fascist movement sweeping Britain.

EPISODE 3 – 11PM

As 1936 comes to a close, 165 Eaton Place is in turmoil: the king is about to abdicate, Agnes is about to give birth, Persie toys with fascism and Sir Hallam makes a shocking discovery about his past.

HALF THE SKY MONDAY-TUESDAY, OCTOBER 1-2, 9PM

HALF THE SKY follows stories of challenge and triumph, traveling with New York Times columnist Nicholas Kristof on a journey to 10 countries, where they meet inspiring individuals and discover how they're confronting the oppression of women and girls. The special, based on the widely acclaimed book *Half the Sky* by columnists Kristof and Sheryl WuDunn, reveals the real, meaningful solutions being fashioned through health care, education and economic empowerment for women and girls.

NATURE WEDNESDAYS, 8PM

"KILAUEA: MOUNTAIN OF FIRE" – OCTOBER 3

Kilauea, on Hawaii's Big Island, is the world's most active volcano. Its latest eruption began in 1983 and hasn't stopped. Since that time, it has created 544 acres of new land and consumed 200 homes. The most spectacular moment of creation is when lava pours into the ocean creating new land through the cataclysmic meeting of 2,000-degree lava and 75-degree ocean water.

"SIBERIAN TIGER QUEST" – OCTOBER 10

Shot in Russia's far eastern forests, the film features the work of Korean cameraman Sooyong Park, the first individual ever to film Siberian tigers in the wild. Park spent years in the forest tracking and filming the world's biggest cat. Park's tracking technique was unconventional, but produced more than a thousand hours of wild tiger footage and captured the saga of a Siberian tiger dynasty.

The extreme gardeners who compete at the annual Cooperstown PumpkinFest weigh-off have one obsessive goal — to raise the biggest giant pumpkin in the world. This program follows Joe Pukos and his fellow competitors through the final harrowing days of harvest and the journey across New York State with the bulging behemoths strapped into the beds of their pick-ups.

"ESCARAMUZA: RIDING FROM THE HEART" – OCTOBER 5

Las Azaleas are a gutsy team of women rodeo riders vying to represent the U.S. at the National Charro Championships in Mexico — where "to be Charro is to be Mexican." *Escaramuza*, or skirmish, describes both the daredevil horseback ballets, ridden sidesaddle at top speed, and the intensity of the competition season.

EPISODE 1 – OCTOBER 7, 7PM

Jenny Lee, a young woman raised in the wealthy English countryside, has chosen to become a nurse and now, as a newly qualified midwife, has gone to work in the poorest area of London. Attached to an order of nursing nuns at Nonnatus House, Jenny is part of a team of women who minister to expectant mothers, many of whom give birth at home in appalling conditions.

EPISODE 2 – OCTOBER 7

As Jenny Lee settles into her role, there is a new arrival at Nonnatus House — Chummy. A welcome pair of extra hands, Chummy sets about showing her worth, but her overwhelming desire to please and her inability to ride a bike prove obstacles in gaining the respect of Sister Evangelina.

EPISODE 3 – OCTOBER 14

Jenny is placed on the district nursing roster for a few weeks, to extend her experience of community practice. During her rounds, she attends to Joe, a gentle old soldier, and a friendship forms. At the antenatal clinic, Trixie and Cynthia enroll Winnie as a new patient. In her 40s, Winnie, who thought her days of diapers and babies were long gone, seems upset by her pregnancy. By contrast, her husband, Ted, is overjoyed. However, at the baby's birth, everyone gets a little surprise.

EPISODE 4 – OCTOBER 21

A baby girl, recently delivered by Jenny, is snatched from her baby carriage, causing great anguish to her family and uniting the local community as they search for the missing child. Meanwhile, Cynthia witnesses another type of loss as she assists in the case of soon-to-be parents David and Margaret. Newly married and excited about their future, everything is put in jeopardy when Margaret develops eclampsia.

EPISODE 5 – OCTOBER 28

Jenny finds herself for once not involved in the beginning of life, but at its end. When Nonnatus House cleaner Peggy's brother Frank is diagnosed with cancer, Jenny and the nuns are called upon to care for him. In doing so, Jenny comes to know the siblings better, learning of their upbringing in a workhouse and the profound effect it had on their relationship.

Ziegfeld's story introduces many of the era's key figures: Irving Berlin, a Russian immigrant who becomes the voice of assimilated America; entertainers, such as Jewish comedienne Fanny Brice and African-American Bert Williams, who become America's first "crossover" artists; and the brash Irish-American George M. Cohan, whose song-and-dance routines embody the energy of Broadway.

"I GOT PLENTY O' NUTTIN' (1930-1942)" – OCTOBER 21

The Great Depression proves to be a dynamic period of creative growth on Broadway, and a dichotomy in the musical theater emerges. Productions like Cole Porter's *Anything Goes* offer glamour and high times as an escape, while others — such as *Of Thee I Sing*, which satirizes the American political system, and the remarkable WPA production of *The Cradle Will Rock*, about a steel strike — deal directly with the era's social and political concerns.





Kurt Simon: A Life of Service


In 1930, a 16-year-old boy set foot for the first time in South Bend. Kurt Simon arrived from Germany with his uncle Charles to a city that was in the midst of the Depression. Studebaker, the main employer in the area, was downsizing and laying off workers. It cut back its main stream automotive lines, relying on a low-cost vehicle called the Rockne to help boost sales. A polio epidemic was gripping South Bend as well. The trolley car was an important mode of transportation and the Oliver Hotel was the place to stay when coming to South Bend.

It is against this backdrop that WNIT proudly presents its newest documentary, *Kurt Simon: A Life of Service*. The story is told by Simon himself, from humble beginnings to attending South Bend Central High School and graduating from the University of Notre Dame. It features the time he met his wife Tessye and, through hard work and dedication, became the CEO of one of the largest wholesale foods and industrial supplies distributors in our area.

Throughout the documentary we'll meet community members who have been touched by Simon's generosity and friendship. Additionally, through the courtesy of the Center for History's archival photography department, viewers will see South Bend in the 1930s – a charming city with a bustling downtown still thriving even in the midst of the Depression.


Some of the programs that have been established by Simon's generosity include The Kurt and Tessye Simon Foundation, which he started with his late wife, Tessye. The Foundation has given millions of dollars towards educational causes, especially advancing the causes of Jewish studies, particularly studies that help educate the community about the Holocaust. Kurt Simon also helped revitalize the downtown by providing money for the Jewish Community Center.
