

SEASON PREMIERES AND SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

As WNIT enters into a new calendar year, many exciting new episodes of your favorite programs and several new shows await our viewers and the Michiana community.

From PBS, we have the much anticipated premiere of *Masterpiece Classic Downton Abbey*, Season 3 coming in January. January will also see the season premieres of the 17th season of *Antiques Roadshow* and the 2nd season of *Market Warriors*. *American Experience* will take you from Henry Ford in January to Silicon Valley in February, with many fascinating stops including Andrew Carnegie, The Abolitionists and John D. Rockefeller along the way. PBS will also feature the much acclaimed and highly anticipated *Makers: Women Who Make America*, a three-hour special about the role of women in shaping America over the last 50 years, premiering in February. These, along with *Secrets of the Highclere Castle* (the setting for *Downton Abbey*), season 3 of *Pioneers of Television*, *Nature*, *NOVA*, *Great Performances* and a new season of *Call the Midwife* just around the corner in March, make for a diverse and exciting start to the year.

Locally, new host Elizabeth Bennion will bring energy, enthusiasm and some new perspectives to the 15th season of *Politically Speaking*. *Dinner & A Book* and *Outdoor Elements* each premiere their 12th seasons in January. The 8th season of *Economic Outlook* and 11th of *Ask an Expert* continue in the New Year and our popular new daily show *Experience Michiana* moves toward its first anniversary in March. Truly a great line-up of programming focusing on issues and happenings right here in Michiana and being produced by the award-winning team at your PBS station, WNIT.

Public Television is also about children and education. The new hit series *Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood*, which premiered in September, has already achieved a top 5 ranking among children 2-5 years old. For over 40 years, *Sesame Street* has set the standard for children's programming, with those children who frequently watched the show in their pre-school years showing high school grade point averages almost 16% higher than those who did not. *Martha Speaks*, *Sid the Science Kid*, *Curious George*, *Dinosaur Train*, *Wild Kratts* and the other great children's programming on WNIT have a similar strong impact by focusing on entertainment and educational value. And, PBSKids.org provides a safe place for your children to learn and play, while various other PBS Learning Media resources provide free information and activities for teachers and parents to explore with their students and children.

Locally, WNIT will be premiering one-minute Parenting Tips that were taped at the "Success by Six" Early Childhood Education Summit in partnership with the United Way of Elkhart County and one-minute "Grow Up Great" early childhood financial literacy segments brought to you in partnership with PNC Bank.

The WNIT staff and management team are excited about another great season of broadcasting, web materials, community outreach and engagement and are energized by the opportunity we have been given to have a positive impact on our community. MASTERPIECE'S DOWNTON ABBEY, SEASON 3

The award-winning *Downton Abbey* returns for its third full season. Each episode will be broadcast twice — Sunday at 9pm and the following Sunday at 7pm or 8pm. Set in the fictional Yorkshire country estate of Downton Abbey, the series depicts the lives of the aristocratic Crawley family and their servants after the post-Edwardian era, including the formation of the Irish Republic in the third series.

EPISODE ONE

**Sunday, January 6, 9pm
and January 13, 7pm**

Wedding guests descend on Downton Abbey, where disasters – large and small – threaten. One is Cora's freewheeling American mother, who tries to loosen up her in-laws.

EPISODE TWO

**Sunday, January 13, 9pm
and January 20, 8pm**

The fate of Downton Abbey hinges on a letter from a dead man. Edith and Sir Anthony face their own fateful moment. Mrs. Hughes confronts a crisis.

EPISODE THREE

**Sunday, January 20, 9pm
and January 27, 8pm**

Two social revolutions arrive at Downton Abbey: the Irish civil war and the fight for women's suffrage. A mysterious conspiracy keeps Anna and Bates apart.

EPISODE FOUR

**Sunday, January 27, 9pm
and February 3, 8pm**

The Crawley family faces its severest test yet. Meanwhile, new faces try to fit into the tight-knit circle of servants. New evidence turns up in a baffling case.

EPISODE FIVE

**Sunday, February 3, 9pm
and February 10, 8pm**

Things go badly amiss at Downton Abbey. Robert and Cora are not speaking. The servants are shunning Matthew's mother, Isobel. And Matthew and Robert have fallen out. Bates takes a gamble.

EPISODE SIX

**Sunday, February 10, 9pm
and February 17, 7pm**

Change arrives in a big way for several key characters at Downton Abbey. A yearly cricket match with the village sees old scores settled and new plots hatched.

EPISODE SEVEN

**Sunday, February 17, 9pm
and February 20, 7pm**

The Crawleys head to a Scottish hunting lodge, while the downstairs staff stays behind at Downton Abbey. New romances flare up, and a crisis unfolds.

**“BROADWAY MUSICALS:
A JEWISH LEGACY”
–JANUARY 1, 9:30PM**

From Broadway’s golden age, names like Irving Berlin, Jerome Kern, the Gershwins, Arthur Laurents, Jerome Robbins, Leonard Bernstein and Stephen Sondheim immediately come to mind. More recently, Broadway babies such as Stephen Schwartz, Marc Shaiman and Andrew Lippa represent a sampling of the Jewish talents who continue to leave their mark on musical theater.

**“PAUL SIMON’S GRACELAND
JOURNEY” – JANUARY 4, 9PM**

Paul Simon’s Graceland album, an experiment in cross-cultural collaboration, was also commercially popular, selling 14 million albums worldwide and winning Grammys for “Album of the Year” and “Song of the Year” for the title track. Today, it’s considered one of the most significant recordings of its time. But why was Graceland so controversial in 1986?

**“ICELANDIC VOLCANOES:
WHO IS NEXT?”**

The 2010 eruption of the Eyjafallajokull volcano in Iceland provoked economic chaos by paralyzing a major air traffic network for days. Through spectacular aerial footage of this country, which is an accumulation of lava and ash, a maze of craters and faults, the episode tries to discern which volcano could wake up next and what the consequences of a major eruption are likely to be. Europe has come to realize that a colossal power sleeps beneath Iceland, while Icelanders for centuries have learned to live amongst their volcanoes.

WHISPERS OF ANGELS: A STORY OF THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD is a documentary that recounts the story of the critical Eastern Line of the Underground Railroad and its role in the 19th century anti-slavery movement in America. Interviews with a cadre of top scholars explore the themes of courage and racial cooperation leading up to the Civil War, plus, dramatic re-enactments filmed on location.

At the Orange County Convention Center, a varied mix of objects turns up for appraisal, including a circa 1975 aerial photograph of the Disney property before EPCOT was built, salvaged by a Disney Imagineer; a rare set of heirloom glass goblets by acclaimed 20th-century Austrian designer Otto Prutscher; and a haunting collection of original photographs brought by Cecil Stoughton, official White House photographer during the Kennedy administration. Documenting JFK’s family life, as well as Lyndon Johnson’s oath of office aboard Air Force One after Kennedy’s assassination, the examples of photographic work are valued at \$75,000.

In Mexico, more than 40 journalists have been slain or have vanished since February 2006, when President Felipe Calderón came to power and launched a government offensive against the country’s powerful drug cartels and organized crime. As the drug war intensifies and the risks to journalists become greater, will the free press be silenced?

HISTORY DETECTIVES

HISTORY DETECTIVES tells four stories of our nation’s beginning. First, Eduardo Pagán starts with a simple bill of sale for a 17-year old “negro girl.” Then Gwen Wright traces a powder horn to a military captain in Massachusetts during the American Revolution. Elyse Luray asks what role a handwritten score played in making “The Star Spangled Banner” our national anthem. Finally, notes in a 1775 almanac show how conflicting loyalties strained family ties during the Revolution.

Vividly bringing to life the epic struggles of the men and women who fought to end slavery, THE ABOLITIONISTS tells the intertwined stories of Frederick Douglass, William Lloyd Garrison, Angelina Grimké, Harriet Beecher Stowe and John Brown. Fighting body and soul, they led the most important civil rights crusade in American history. The series airs 150 years after the Emancipation Proclamation took effect in January 1863.

“CUBA: THE ACCIDENTAL EDEN”

Cuba’s varied landscape, its location in the heart of the Caribbean and its place at the center of Cold War politics have all combined to preserve some of the richest and most unusual natural environments of the hemisphere. For decades, Cuba’s wild landscapes lay untouched while its Caribbean neighbors poisoned or paved over their ecological riches. Now, Cuba’s priceless treasures are about to face an onslaught. Tourism, already on the rise, is expected to double once the U.S. trade embargo ends. What will happen to Cuba’s stunning biodiversity — amphibians, reptiles and the most biologically diverse freshwater fish in the region?

Were Neanderthals really mentally inferior, as inexpressive and clumsy as the cartoon caveman they inspired? NOVA examines a range of new evidence for Neanderthal self-expression and language, suggesting that we may have underestimated our long-vanished cousins.

“ANTIQUING IN CHICAGO” – JANUARY 14

The pickers head to the Randolph Street Market in Chicago, Illinois, where the target assignment is to find something from the 1970s. One picker runs out of time as another intentionally tries to hoodwink his opponents about an item made three decades later. Notable finds include a pair of mid-century fiberglass chairs, a modern coffee table and an Aunt Jemima clock.

EVERGLADES OF THE NORTH MONDAY, JANUARY 14, 10PM AND SUNDAY, JANUARY 20, 5PM

Less than a century ago, the Grand Kankakee Marsh once saturated nearly a million acres in Northern Indiana and part of Illinois. This documentary reveals the diverse ecology, illustrates the astonishing history, and explores the controversial saga of the Grand Kankakee Marsh and how people have used and perceived this wetland for more than 10,000 years.

PIONEERS OF TELEVISION TUESDAYS, JANUARY 15- FEBRUARY 5, 8PM

“FUNNY LADIES” – JANUARY 15, 8PM AND JANUARY 21, 10PM

This episode features the first standup comedienne to appear on television — legends such as Phyllis Diller and Joan Rivers. It also looks at Lucille Ball’s breakthrough on “I Love Lucy” and the sitcom stars who followed, including Mary Tyler Moore, Betty White and Marla Gibbs. The episode covers television’s most enduring variety star, Carol Burnett, and features interviews with contemporary actresses including Tina Fey and Margaret Cho.

“PRIMETIME SOAPS” – JANUARY 22, 8PM AND JANUARY 28, 10PM

“Dallas” and “Dynasty” kicked off the nighttime soap frenzy in the late 1970s and spun off the long-lasting series “Knots Landing.” Sometimes forgotten is the genre’s antecedent: 1964’s “Peyton Place,” which starred Mia Farrow and Ryan O’Neal. Interviewees in this episode include Larry Hagman, Joan Collins, Linda Evans, Diahann Carroll, Linda Gray, Patrick Duffy, Michele Lee, Joan Van Ark and Donna Mills.

HENRY FORD: AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

TUESDAY, JANUARY 29, 9PM

HENRY FORD paints a fascinating portrait of a farm boy who rose from obscurity to become the most influential American innovator of the 20th century. Ford’s Model T automobile and his five-dollar-a-day wage ushered in the modern world, earning Ford reverence from millions of Americans. Later, in frustration, he lashed out at enemies, real and imagined, blamed Jews for the country’s problems, bullied those who worked for him and exhibited great cruelty to his only son.

SHAKESPEARE UNCOVERED FRIDAYS, FEBRUARY 1-8, 9PM

“RICHARD II WITH DEREK JACOBI” – FEBRUARY 1, 9PM

Derek Jacobi returns to a role he played 30 years ago, coaches actors at the Globe in aspects of the play, reveals why it could have cost Shakespeare his life — and shares some of the extraordinary modern political parallels within the play that still resonate as dictators are deposed.

“HENRY IV & HENRY V WITH JEREMY IRONS” – FEBRUARY 1, 10PM

Jeremy Irons uncovers the enduring appeal of Shakespeare’s “history plays,” from the facts of English history to the father-son drama that Shakespeare created. He invites the viewer behind the scenes at the filming of some of the most important sequences in the new GREAT PERFORMANCES adaptations of both plays, starring Irons, with Tom Hiddleston as Prince Hal.

“HAMLET WITH DAVID TENNANT” – FEBRUARY 8, 9PM

“ANTIQUING IN ORONOCO, MN” – FEBRUARY 25



Andrew Carnegie's life embodied the American dream: the immigrant who went from rags to riches, the self-made man who became a captain of industry, the king of steel. He preached the obligation of the wealthy to return their money to the societies where they made it — then added, says Carnegie's biographer, Joseph Frazier Wall, "a very revealing sentence. He wrote, 'and besides, it provides a refuge from self-questioning.'"
