


ON THE COVER

MICHIANA'S RISING STAR

On Friday, August 2, WNIT will announce the winner of its inaugural "Michiana's Rising Star" contest, capping a seven-month competition throughout our broadcast area. The talent search began in January when over 150 contestants answered the call to sing, dance and display their talents. During May and June, WNIT conducted regional auditions in Benton Harbor, South Bend, Elkhart, Culver and Warsaw.

The top five performers from each of the five regions will now compete at the WNIT studio each evening from Sunday, July 28 through Friday, August 2, to determine the grand prize winner and "Michiana's Rising Star."

The grand prize winner will receive \$1,000 cash and the opportunity to appear on WNIT programs. Awards will be given to other top contestants. Judging will be conducted by area arts professionals, media personnel, professional performers and local celebrities. In addition, the public will be invited to text in to vote for their favorites.



Sunday, July 28, 8 to 9:30pm. The twenty-five finalists will be seen on tape from their regional performances. Based on the judges' scores and viewers' text-votes, a select number will continue in the competition.

Monday through Thursday, July 29 to August 1, 8pm. Each night the remaining contestants will perform live in the WNIT studio and each night the results of the judging and texting will determine who continues in the contest.

Friday, August 2 at 8pm, the top finalists perform one last time. At the close of the program, the winners will be announced. WNIT will stage a block-party in front of the studio building that evening. We will block off West Jefferson between Lafayette and Franklin for a dazzling display of talent, music and refreshments to cheer on all the contestants and their supporters.

THE STATUE OF LIBERTY TUESDAY, JULY 2, 8PM

This 1985 Ken Burns film explores the creation and history of the remarkable Statue of Liberty and what she represents to all Americans. The film traces the development of the monument — from its conception to its fascinating and often controversial construction to its final dedication — and offers interviews with a wide range of Americans.

MOUNT RUSHMORE: AMERICAN EXPERIENCE TUESDAY, JULY 2, 9PM

High on a granite cliff in South Dakota's Black Hills tower the huge carved faces of four American presidents. Together they constitute the world's largest sculpture. The story of Mount Rushmore's creation is as bizarre and wonderful as the monument itself. It is the tale of Gutzon Borglum, a hyperactive, temperamental artist whose talent and determination propelled the project, even as his ego and obsession threatened to tear it apart.

NATURE WEDNESDAYS, 8PM

“AMERICAN EAGLE” – JULY 3

Unique to North America, the bald eagle is the continent's most recognizable aerial predator, with a shocking white head, electric yellow beak and penetrating eyes. In the 1960s, this symbol of the United States became an emblem of environmental degradation, as the pesticide DDT and other human pressures brought it to the brink of extinction. Following their protection as an endangered species, bald eagles have come roaring back.

“DOGS DECODED” – JULY 3

Dogs have been domesticated for longer than any other animal on the planet, and humans have developed a unique relationship with these furry friends. What is surprising, however, is research showing that humans, in turn, respond to dogs with the same hormone responsible for bonding mothers to their babies.


“3D SPIES OF WWII” – JULY 24

**THE CLEVELAND ORCHESTRA:
BOULEZ PLAYS MAHLER
FRIDAY, JULY 5, 9PM**

Pierre Boulez conducts Gustav Mahler's Adagio from Symphony No. 10 in F-Sharp Major and "Des Knaben Wunderhorn" ("The Youth's Magic Horn"), Songs for Voice and Orchestra, with soloists Magdalena Kožená and Christian Gerhaher. Recorded in 2010 at Severance Hall, the home of the Cleveland Orchestra, the performance marked the 150th anniversary of Mahler's birth, the 100th anniversary of his death and Boulez' 45th year conducting the orchestra.

THE SPENCERS
SUNDAY, JULY 7, 8PM**

Althorp, childhood home and final resting place of Princess Diana, is currently the home of Diana's brother, Charles, the 9th Earl Spencer. Nineteen generations of Spencers have presided over this grand estate for more than 500 years. The Spencer dynasty has produced politicians, military heroes, dukes and duchesses and will one day furnish Britain with a king: Diana's son, Prince William.

"GIRL" – JULY 7

DC Morse (Shaun Evans) and DI Thursday (Roger Allam) investigate burgled gas meters, the sudden death of a young secretarial student and a string of Post Office robberies, confounding the solution to a pair of violent murders. Could Morse's future on the force be in jeopardy?

"FUGUE" – JULY 14

Morse and Thursday are confronted with a new breed of murderer, as a string of Oxford homicides continues with no end in sight. The entire police department is working round the clock and a special expert comes on to assist, but Morse's love of opera may be the key to stopping the killing.

"ROCKET" – JULY 21

A royal visit to a family-owned munitions factory begins as a proud occasion for the people of Oxford, but the joyous day ends with murder. Morse delves into the family's murky past, as well as his own, as he attempts to uncover the culprit before more lives are lost.

"HOME" – JULY 28

While studying for his upcoming sergeant's exam, Morse investigates the hit-and-run death of an eminent Oxford professor. The pressure mounts with his father's illness and the appearance of an enemy threatening to reveal aspects of Inspector Thursday's past. In the end, Morse must choose between the responsibilities of his job and loyalty to his mentor.

**CALL THE MIDWIFE, SEASON 2
SUNDAYS, JULY 7-28, 10:30PM**

EPISODE 4 – JULY 7

Returning from her stint at the London Hospital, Jenny needs all her midwifery skill when she and Sister Evangelina assist at the birth of a baby born with spina bifida. The parents struggle to understand and accept their son's condition. Jenny, who has never delivered a disabled child, struggles to accept the implications the illness could have for the child's future. Nonnatus House, meanwhile, plays host to an acquaintance of Chummy's — an eccentric cleric who befriends Jane.

EPISODE 5 – JULY 14

The whole Poplar community pulls together to prepare for the annual Summer Fete. This year, with the introduction of a baby show, the midwives will be more involved than ever, especially Trixie, who assumes responsibility

for securing a celebrity judge. At the ante-natal clinic, Jenny meets Nora, an impoverished mother of eight, who is distraught that she may soon have another mouth to feed. Jenny's attempts to reassure her fall on deaf ears, and a desperate Nora takes matters into her own hands.

EPISODE 6 – JULY 21

Dr. Turner is determined that Poplar will no longer live under the threat of tuberculosis. While the nuns and nurses support his campaign to bring screening facilities to the area, Jenny's nursing rounds lead her to a family that has suffered devastating misfortune from the disease. Now, Jenny works to reconcile the dying father and his only remaining daughter. Having secured a visit from a TB screening van, Dr. Turner pulls off an epic day, backed by the midwives, but little can prepare them for what the results will mean for one of their own.

EPISODE 7 – JULY 28

On Cynthia's district rounds, she administers daily insulin to a man who consistently belittles his wife, Annie. A visit from Annie's son and support from Cynthia help Annie gain confidence and start to change her life. Jenny witnesses persecution of a different kind when she looks after a black mother-to-be who is subjected to racial prejudice from neighbors. Funded by the success of the Summer Fete,

Nonnatus House takes ownership of a scooter to help with rounds. Fred teaches the midwives to ride — with amusing and unforeseen results. Everyone is thrilled when Chummy and Peter return from Sierra Leone with a surprise.

LEWIS & CLARK: THE JOURNEY OF THE CORPS OF DISCOVERY TUESDAYS, JULY 9-16, 8PM

Sent by President Thomas Jefferson to find the fabled Northwest Passage, Meriwether Lewis and William Clark led the most important expedition in American history — a voyage of danger and discovery from St. Louis to the headwaters of the Missouri River, over the Continental Divide to the Pacific. This program tells the remarkable story of the entire corps — not just the two famous captains, but the young army men, French-Canadian boatmen, Clark's African-American slave and the Shoshone woman, Sacagawea, who brought along her infant son.

SECRETS OF THE DEAD TUESDAYS AND WEDNESDAYS

“ULTIMATE TUT” – JULY 10, 9PM

Ninety years ago in Egypt's Valley of the Kings, the greatest archaeological find in history was made: the discovery of Tutankhamen's tomb and its golden treasures. It made Tutankhamen the most famous name in ancient Egyptian

history. But the real story has become shrouded in myth — with many mysteries around the tomb unsolved to this day.

“BONES OF THE BUDDHA” – JULY 23, 10PM


In 1898, workers digging at a mysterious hill in Northern India made an amazing discovery: a huge stone coffer, containing five reliquary jars, more than 1,000 separate jewels and some ash and bone. One of the jars bore an inscription that appeared to say that these were the remains of the Buddha himself. This seemed to be the most extraordinary find in Indian archaeology. But doubt and scandal have hung over this amazing find for more than 100 years.

SECRETS OF CHATSWORTH SUNDAY, JULY 14, 8PM

In its 500-year history, Chatsworth has been home to some notable inhabitants, among them the 5th Duke of Devonshire, his wife, Lady Georgiana Spencer, and Lady Elizabeth Foster, who lived together in a ménage à trois. King Edward VII enjoyed shooting parties on the estate and was often entertained by Duchess Louisa, one of Britain's foremost political hostesses. Duchess Louisa's daughter-in-law, American Consuelo Yznaga del Valle, introduced American heiresses into the British aristocracy; many of these young women married British noblemen.

To them, bigger definitely meant better, and better meant more lethal.

SECRETS OF HIGHCLERE CASTLE SUNDAY, JULY 21, 8PM

As the setting of “Downton Abbey,” it may be more famous now than any time in its 1,300-year history, but England’s Highclere Castle has its own stories to tell. In its heyday, Highclere was the social epicenter of Edwardian England. See how all the inhabitants of Highclere lived, aristocrats and servants, and find out how the current inhabitants, Lord and Lady Carnarvon, spend their \$1 million in annual upkeep funds, and what life in a fairytale castle is like today.

Two-and-a-half millennia ago, a new religion was born in northern India, generated from the ideas of a single man, the Buddha, a mysterious Indian sage who famously gained enlightenment while he sat under a large fig tree.
