## WNIT's *EducationCounts\_Michiana* Makes Great Impact Over the Last Year!

*EducationCounts\_Michiana*, WNIT's weekly, program series and internet-based resource, was launched in November 2016 with the intention of highlighting positive examples of learning in the Michiana area, as well as identifying problem areas in education from birth to retirement and developing solutions to combat those problems. Two series in our first year that focused heavily on educational issues were "Mental Health & Trauma" and "Expansion of the Summer Semester."

"Mental Health & Trauma" is often an issue that flies under the radar in the classroom. Past trauma, abuse, parent's divorce, etc., are all issues that impact the academic success of a student. We talked with experts and teachers who are working to identify issues and get students the help they need.

"Expansion of the Summer Semester" profiled three area colleges who have expanded course offerings in the summer. Many students are now taking advantage of this third semester to complete their undergraduate degree in 3 years. College students today are often taking on a lot of debt to go to school, and because of that debt, they are incentivized to enter the workforce as quickly as possible.

*EducationCounts\_Michiana* highlighted many wins throughout the education community. Three stories, in particular, touched the heart of our viewers throughout the community. Tippecanoe Schools, along with help from a state grant, installed a wind turbine to power their schools. Plymouth High School's Dance Marathon raised money for Riley's Hospital in Indianapolis. And, in St. Joseph, Michigan, the Project Search program gave students with disabilities an opportunity to work in the hospital as interns.

We have listened to our viewers and educators and will be telling the stories they are requesting. These are stories that will shed even more light on complex educational topics that we know will jumpstart many important conversations. We look forward to getting feedback from our viewers that will continue to shape the future of *Education Counts\_Michiana*.

## WNIT to Air *Civilizations*

Acclaimed film, theater and television actor Liev Schreiber will narrate this series, which tells the story of art from the dawn of human history to the present day — for the first time on a global scale.

*Civilizations* will premiere on WNIT on Tuesday, April 17, 8pm, with the next four episodes airing Tuesdays through May 15. Four more episodes will air in June.

The two episodes airing in April are:

"The Second Moment of Creation" (April 17) - Seventy thousand years ago, the first known examples of humans expressing themselves creatively were simple, abstract etchings. Over tens of thousands of years, this impulse evolved into painted and sculpted depictions of the animal world ... and eventually of the human form itself.

"How Do We Look?" (April 24) - From the Terracotta Army of China to the Colossi of Ramses II in Egypt, the human form has been a dominant subject for artists throughout history. Each civilization and era, however, sees the meaning of this art differently.

In nine episodes, *Civilizations* travels across the globe, visiting such cultural landmarks as the great mosques of Istanbul, the ancient cities of Mesoamerica, the Buddhist caves of Ajanta in India, the Aztecs' Templo Mayor in modern Mexico City and the funeral site of China's first emperor. *Civilizations* explores a sweeping range of topics, including the earliest human cultural artifacts and the representation of the body in art, what happens when different civilizations encounter each other, and the nature of "renaissances" around the world.


