It might not feel like it yet while we look out the window, but I am officially looking forward to the thaw. There is a sense of blossoming starting here at the station as we move into March and April—not just in the weather, but in the breadth and creativity of storytelling we’re getting ready to share.

Our cover features the Veldman family, whose name has become synonymous with local entrepreneurship and community pride. Their story is a classic American arc: arriving here as immigrants from the Netherlands and eventually founding Tire Rack. This sprawling family is a reminder that the most compelling *Legends* are those who built the foundation we stand on today. Their legacy is a testament to the deep roots that keep our community strong (even when the ground is still frozen).

That local focus is the heartbeat of our Impact Report, which you’ll find highlighted on page 3. We’ve dedicated that space to show you exactly how your support translates into the work we do every day. It’s a record of the mission that you make possible. I hope you’ll follow the link on that page to view the full report online and see just how far your contributions go.

But, this season of transition and growth comes with a heavy heart for our team as we mourn the loss of Kelly Burgét. She was a vital part of *Experience Michiana*, serving as its host for nine years, and a true light at the station. You’ll find space dedicated to her memory in our local programming pages, including a video tribute. She was a dear friend to so many, and we honor her life and the legacy she leaves behind.

Looking at the changing landscape around us, we’re bringing *Economic Outlook* and host Jeff Rea back from hiatus for a one-hour special on data centers. We’re examining the massive digital infrastructure proposals—potential projects that represent a complex shift in both our regional economy and our physical surroundings. This special will provide some much-needed context on the situation and explore what this evolution could mean for our area’s future.

And in April, I’m so excited for you to watch *South Bend: Built by Baseball*. This is a unique look at the history of the sport right here in South Bend—how it’s grown, how it’s changed, and what it’s meant to generations of ball players. It takes a look beyond the game and into our own city.

You’ll also notice our PBS KIDS pages have grown. We’ve added new sections specifically for educators and young adults to ensure we’re supporting local students and teachers at every stage of the journey.

And, for literature lovers like me, you’ll find new life breathed into some classic stories—the classic literary worlds of *The Count of Monte Cristo*, the introspective wisdom of Henry David Thoreau, and the trials and triumphs of the Forsytes. We’re also looking forward to some revolutionary intrigue with Lucy Worsley as the season warms up.

South Bend: Built by Baseball

Baseball laid the foundation for South Bend's growth. In the early 20th century, Black Studebaker employees formed the Foundry Giants, despite facing long shifts and segregation. The women of the South Bend Blue Sox broke barriers and inspired others to chase their dreams. Migrant farmworkers created a Mexican-American league that fostered decades of community connection and organizing. Today, investment in the South Bend Cubs fuels both the game and downtown's growth. Across generations, baseball has shaped the city - South Bend was, and is, "Built by Baseball."

On the eve of America's 250th anniversary, popular British historian Lucy Worsley investigates the sabotage, espionage, and unrest that led to the birth of a new nation. In 1776, 13 American colonies declared independence from one of the most powerful empires in the world, igniting a bloody eight-year war that claimed thousands of lives and ended in Britain's humiliating defeat. Over two episodes, Lucy delves deeper into the American Revolution by examining it from the British perspective, discovering the human drama, radical ideas, and political missteps behind this seismic split, and revealing how losing America changed Britain forever.

Episode One (April 7, 2026) takes Lucy to New York's City Hall Park, where George Washington's troops heard the Declaration of Independence read aloud — a rallying cry that inspired rebels to destroy a statue of King George III and melt it into musket balls. At the New York

Historical, Lucy examines a relic of this defiance and asks whether the rupture was inevitable. She then travels home to England to uncover the British perspective, studying King George's maps and visiting Benjamin Franklin's London home. She traces British and American tensions rising from Britain's punitive taxes and the Stamp Act of 1765. In Boston, Lucy explores how the Boston Massacre and Boston Tea Party were flashpoints that pushed Americans toward war. Finally, Lucy reveals the radical voices — John Wilkes and Thomas Paine — whose words crystallized America's vision of liberty and independence.

Episode Two (April 14, 2026) uncovers how the war reverberated in Britain itself. At Portsmouth Royal Dockyard, Lucy investigates James Aitken's shocking arson plot to cripple the Royal Navy. She traces Franklin's secret mission to Paris to secure French support, while British spy Edward Bancroft fed intelligence

back to London. Lucy explores Britain's growing fears as France — and later Spain — joined the conflict, and how Irish Volunteers forced Britain to lift trade restrictions between Ireland and America. Back in London, riots erupted, and George III agonized over the possibility of losing the empire. By 1781, Britain's campaign collapsed at Yorktown, and two years later, Britain formally recognized American independence. She concludes her investigation at Grosvenor Square, the site of America's first embassy in London.

30 Years of Public Media Storytelling

with Senior Producer
Brenda Bowyer

This month Brenda Bowyer marks three decades at WNIT. We wanted to turn the spotlight around and give Brenda some space to reflect on her journey and celebrate with her.

Congratulations Brenda!

Can you tell us how you came to work at WNIT and how you evolved into becoming a senior producer?

I received my undergrad degree from Manchester University in Radio & TV and a minor in Journalism. I have had three jobs since graduating – one in journalism at the *Plymouth Pilot*, one in radio at WGTC/WUBU and one in television which is here at WNIT.

Over the last three decades, my evolution into a Senior Producer wasn't just about changes in technology and equipment but about the relationship between the lens and the subject and everything that comes after. I've spent well over 20 years teaching studio and field production and overseeing our internship program, which keeps my skills sharp and my perspective fresh and challenged. Transitioning into a senior producer has meant taking those years of experience

and using them to shape new and ongoing projects.

Ten years ago, I earned a Masters of Fine Arts Degree from Goddard College. My interdisciplinary arts degree focused on ethics and the power of storytelling in film, television and photography. I learned so much about new ways to look at creative work and to continue growing. Those skills continue to sharpen me and shape the way I approach learning and creating new projects.

What exactly does a producer do?

I often compare producing to being a chef. You're responsible for the entire experience - from the initial concept, to assembling the right ingredients, to shaping everything into a finished piece that works. It's both creative and logistical.

Like a chef thinking about the people they're serving, a producer is always considering the audience - what will engage them, what will resonate and how to bring all the elements together in a way that feels intentional and complete. You're not just making something, it's crafting an experience from start to finish.

Why do you work in public media?

I've always wanted to work in television. I love the transition from vaudeville to the Golden Age of radio and classic television. I have always been interested in how they are assembled. I worked in radio as a copywriter to produce commercials. Often times, commercials are 30 second stories. So, I figured if I was able tell a story concise enough for 30 or 60 seconds that I could do a lot more with more time. That I found my place in public media was such a perfect match for me. I profoundly enjoy making meaningful work and that's exactly the mission of public television.

Reflecting on the body of your work what was your favorite project and why?

It's hard to choose a favorite because each project has its own life and lessons. My first big project for the station was a 10-minute documentary about Ruthmere Museum. It was especially formative and forced me to find my footing quickly.

Open Studio was a live, weekly, four-hour series brilliantly created by Trina Cutter, our general manager at the time. Rodney Jernas and I were very young, very fresh, very eager producer directors. We alternated roles each week – one week he would direct and I would produce and vice versa. It demanded both discipline and creativity, and it accelerated my growth in ways nothing else could have.

Since then, every program and documentary has felt like a collaboration between myself and the project, each with its own rhythm and its own demands. Like working with a different dance partner each time, every project continues to shape me in a new way.

Do you have any advice/guidance/insight for young documentarians?

Listen to your inner voice. Find the challenge and stretch yourself. Don't settle for being safe and don't ever fool yourself into believing that good enough is good enough.

What else do you do outside of WNIT?

I'm constantly seeking out new experiences and knowledge. I love traveling, exploring different cultures & foods and trying new things. I really believe we embody what we live through, so the more I experience, the more depth and perspective I can bring into my life which can enrich my work.





STUDENT REPORTING LABS



PBS News Student Reporting Labs (SRL) is a department within PBS News, which is part of the DC-area PBS station WETA. Student Reporting Labs was founded by Leah Clapman in 2009 as an experiment of the **PBS News Hour: What could national news stories look like if reported in partnership with local high school broadcast and journalism classes?**

It started with six pilot schools reporting video stories in their communities; by 2020, SRL served 180 schools across the US, with hundreds more on the waitlist. To meet this demand, SRL launched **StoryMaker** in 2022, which is now the primary (free!!) entry point for students and teachers to learn how to report stories in their communities and receive guidance from SRL staff. Over 10,000 people now use the tutorials, lesson plans, and prompts in StoryMaker.

OUR VISION

Our vision is a world in which young people's voices are heard and valued, free expression meets journalistic integrity, and SRL leads a



diverse and creative community of practice in media and journalism education. We believe thoughtful local reporting helps young people cultivate curiosity, empathy, civic awareness, and find their power.

Youth perspectives are essential for telling complete and nuanced stories. So, we amplify youth voices.

The future of journalism depends on diverse voices and inclusive storytelling. So, we offer free journalism training and tools for students and their educators to report stories in their communities.

Our work is grounded in our values: Listening, Integrity, Equity, Collaboration, Representation, Curiosity, Intentionality, and Respect.

STORYMAKER: Sign up for StoryMaker, our free learning platform for students and educators with free tutorials, lesson plans, and prompts. Once you register for StoryMaker, you'll receive regular email updates and opportunities straight to your inbox.

This year, we're offering reporting opportunities across formats, topics, and skill levels — podcast production, social media video, longer form video packages, plus in-person training and more opportunities to get support from our team. PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT

To support SRL students and educators throughout the production process, SRL's youth media producers are available to consult on

classroom issues, story pitches, script-writing, narration, rough cuts, and editing.

Selected student stories may be published on the SRL website, shared on social media, distributed through other media partnerships, or aired on local PBS stations and PBS News Hour nightly broadcasts.

FREE IN-PERSON TRAINING

FOR EDUCATORS: The SRL Teacher Workshop is SRL's flagship yearly educator professional development event: a three-day hands-on journalism and technology training for teachers. Typically held in late July, applications open in early spring.

FOR STUDENTS: The SRL Summer Academy is SRL's flagship student training event, an all-expenses-paid week of journalism training and reporting stories with the Student Reporting Labs team. Typically held in late June, applications open in early spring.


